APPELLANT'S MOTION FOR CONSOLIDATION OF CLAIMS

The Appellant, Jeffery W. Wilder pursuant to Rule 214 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, moves the court to consolidate the above stated claims, Appellate Case No.: 2020-001209 and Appellate Case No.: 2020-001232. In support of this motion, the Appellant shows the following to the court:

1. The subject matter at heart in both actions is the SC House Seat 109 election and the entities named in the actions all play a part in the election process. The factual issues to be addressed to the court would be substantially the same.
2. The issues of Tedder's electorate status in the claim with the Charleston Board of Voter Registration are also a part of the constitutional issues in the declaratory action.
3. The Appellant, Charleston County Board of Voter Registration & Deon Tedder are parties in both actions.
4. The joinder of the claims is essential as the parties that would be joined in the action all have a direct and substantial interest not only in the subject matter of the claims but also in the outcome of it.
