MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Dawone Q. Davis respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. 

On February 4, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Brandon Davis with this Court. On February 1, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant in State v. Miguel Herrera with this Court, and filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. James Lamarcus Page with this Court. On January 28, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant in State v. Randy Mitchell with this Court, and filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Gary Michael Piper v. State in the Supreme Court. On January 22, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Reginald Canty with this Court. On January 14, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Keith R. Bradley v. State in the Supreme Court.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.




