ORDER

Appellants have appealed an order of the circuit court consolidating these two actions for trial. That appeal is currently pending in the court of appeals.¹

Appellants now ask this Court to certify the appeal pursuant to Rule 204(b), SCACR. We grant the request and certify the case to this Court. Because the consolidation order does not involve the merits of the action or affect Petitioners' substantial rights, it is an interlocutory order that is not immediately appealable. See S.C. Code Ann. § 14-3-330 (indicating an interlocutory order that involves the merits of an action or affects a party's substantial rights may be immediately reviewed by an appellate court); see also *Salmonsens v. CGD, Inc.*, 377 S.C. 442, 453, 661 S.E.2d 81, 87 (2008) (holding claims of denial of a mode of trial require a determination of whether or not a party is erroneously denied a trial by jury in a law case, or is erroneously required to proceed before a jury in an equity case; however, the mode of trial analysis always includes the consideration of the availability of trial). Accordingly, we dismiss the appeal.
