Dear Counsel:

In this post-conviction relief matter, you have filed a motion to exceed the page limit of twenty-five pages for a petition for a writ of certiorari. *See* Rule 243(e)(3) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). Together with this motion, you have filed a proposed petition consisting of twenty-seven pages.

An examination of your petition indicates that multiple areas of "blank" or "white" space exist within the petition.¹ If you were to simply reformat the petition to eliminate these blank spaces, it appears the petition could be reduced to twenty-five pages without violating any provision of Rule 267, SCACR.

Accordingly, no action will be taken on the motion to exceed the page limit. Instead, you should reformat the petition to meet the page limitation, and serve and file this amended petition within ten (10) days of the date of this letter. If, of course, you are unable meet the page limitation by reformatting, you may then
