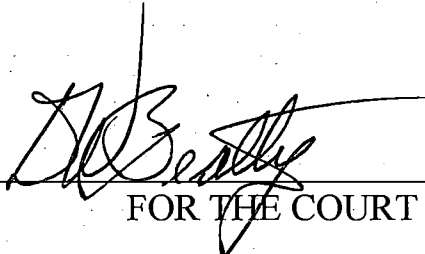

ORDER

Counsel for petitioner seeks an extension of time to serve and file the petition for writ of certiorari to the court of appeals in this matter. In light of the fact that counsel has already received an extension of twenty days and because counsel has failed to cite any extraordinary reasons for granting the extension, the motion for an extension of time is denied. *RE: Extensions in Cases Seeking a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari to Review a Decision of the South Carolina Court of Appeals*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated July 16, 2014 (<http://www.sccourts.org/whatsnew/displaywhatsnew.cfm?indexID=963>), (permitting extensions beyond twenty days based only on "extraordinary circumstances such as illness or other circumstances beyond the control of the movant warrant the granting of the extension. The parties are warned that the press of other business is not an extraordinary circumstance which will warrant the granting of an extension."
