(1)(2) Automatic Extension. The due dates for all Appellate Court filings due during the period of March 20, 2020, thru June 8, 2020, are automatically extended for twenty (20) days. [footnote omitted]. Lawyers and litigants are warned that this automatic extension does not extend the time to serve a notice of appeal under Rules 203, 243, and 247, SCACR. This automatic extension is inapplicable to due dates after June 8, 2020.
