ORDER

Petitioner's application for post-conviction relief was denied by Judge G. Thomas Cooper, Jr. No notice of appeal was filed. Petitioner now seeks a writ of certiorari from an order issued by Judge Roger E. Henderson granting him a belated review of Judge Cooper's order pursuant to *Austin v. State*, 305 S.C. 453, 409 S.E.2d 395 (1991).

Petitioner's counsel asserts that the petition for certiorari from Judge Cooper's order is without merit and requests permission to withdraw from further representation. Petitioner has filed two pro se responses.

The panel voted to grant the petition for writ of certiorari from Judge Henderson's order, dispense with further briefing, and conduct an *Austin* review of Judge Cooper's order.

Based on the vote of the panel after careful consideration of the entire appendix and Petitioner's pro se responses as required by *Johnson v. State*, 294 S.C. 310, 364 S.E.2d 201 (1988), the petition for a writ of certiorari is denied and counsel's request to withdraw is granted.



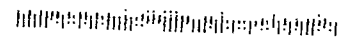
