MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Walter Murrey respectfully requests a **final twelve business day extension from Tuesday, December 1, 2020 until Thursday, December 17, 2020**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. **Counsel will make every effort to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter before the deadline if possible.** This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court Tuesday, December 1, 2020.

2. Counsel for Walter Murrey respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist, counsel's health problems chief among them, which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. *Counsel has missed time in the office due to a non-COVID-19 related illness and severe back pain after twice testing negative for COVID-19. He has missed time from work, consulted with his neurosurgeon about back problems, and followed up on a hospital visit with other doctors and appointments. The illness, unfortunately, has necessitated the final two extraordinary extensions today.* Counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Franklin Pierre Dover with this Court today, December 1, 2020. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Robert Frost v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 20, 2020. Counsel had an oral argument before the Supreme Court on November 17, 2020 in The State v. Ahshaad Mykiel Owens. Counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Robert Wayne Eaves with this Court on November 13, 2020. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the death penalty case of The State v. Timothy Ray Jones, Jr. with the Supreme Court on October 23, 2020 with co-counsel Susan Hackett, David Alexander, Lara Caudy, and Taylor Gilliam. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in case of The State v. Stewart Jerome Middleton with this Court on October 15, 2020. Counsel also finished amending his PowerPoint yesterday for his presentation for the 2020-2021 Appellate Project Project CLE for this Thursday, December 3, 2020. In addition, counsel must prepare for the oral argument in the Supreme Court in State v. Joseph Bowers which will be held on Tuesday, December 8, 2020. Finally, counsel is also lead


counsel in two other ongoing death penalty cases in the Supreme Court besides The State v. Timothy Ray Jones, Jr., Andres Torres v. The State, and The State v. Jerome Jenkins. **Counsel has extensive administrative duties as the Chief Appellate Defender, including Appellate Project oversight duties and management of the work from home personnel during this coronavirus pandemic. Counsel also has to discuss the cases of four inexperienced Appellate Defenders with them in advance and read all of their filings in advance. Counsel regrets, and indeed apologizes, for the necessity of this extension request, but it is absolutely necessary under the circumstances which include counsel's recent health concerns.**

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Opposing counsel, the Attorney General's Office, has graciously consented to this extension request by way of the extended thirty-day general consent granted by Deputy Attorney General Donald J. Zelenka for all Appellate Defense extensions through December 31, 2020. That extended, emailed general consent was dated November 25, 2020.




