Thank you for sending a copy of Claire Allen's letter to all parties concerning multiple notices of appeal.

The initial appeal filed July 15, 2020 was to an Order transferring this entire matter to the Master-in-Equity for Charleston County. The Master had a status conference and on August 18, 2020 referred the entire matter back to the Circuit Court.

All the Defendant/Respoondents on September 15, 2020 filed a Motion to Dismiss that appeal as being moot, which has not yet been ruled upon by the Court of Appeals.

Thereafter, after the entire matter was referred back to the Circuit Court, Judge Price set and heard various Motions for Summary Judgment, and his Orders on these Motions is the subject of this second appeal.
