State v. Smith, 265 S.E.2d 164, 169 (N.C. 1980) (explaining substantial evidence is “such relevant evidence as a reasonable mind might accept as adequate to support a conclusion.”)

State v. Powell, 261 S.E.2d 114, 117 (N.C. 1980) (explaining substantial evidence is merely evidence that is “existing and real, not just seeming or imaginary.”)

State v. Bernhardt, 813 P.2d 436 (Mont. 1991) (defining substantial evidence and noting trier of fact determines which of two interpretations of circumstantial evidence is most reasonable)
