1 WHEREUPON,

2 **JOE T.N. MCFADDEN,**

3 was duly sworn by the clerk.

4 MR. DURANT: Your Honor, standing
5 before you is Joe Tajharey Natron McFadden. He is
6 pleading guilty in indictment 2018-GS-14-151 and
7 152. Both are counts of distribution of crack
8 cocaine. Indictment 2018-153, possession with
9 intent to distribute crack cocaine. Indictment
10 2018-154 through 157 is four additional counts of
11 distribution of crack cocaine. Mr. McFadden is
12 represented by Scott Robinson with the Public
13 Defender's Office; and the recommendation is the
14 same as it was for Mr. Eppes, 15 years suspended
15 to 12 years, followed by 5 years probation. We've
16 also agreed that Mr. McFadden can be released from
17 the county jail he's been in. His bond was
18 actually revoked last Spring. He's been in since
19 that time. We've agreed that he can be, that he
20 will be released and have to report back on
21 January 22nd for sentencing. Another condition is
22 that he be of good behavior: That he's not to be
23 arrested during the interim period, and that he is
24 of good behavior and report back on the 22nd, then
25 he will ask the judge to impose the recommended

1 sentence.

2 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. McFadden, is
3 that your understanding as well, sir? You're
4 gonna plead guilty to these charges today. I'm
5 going to defer sentencing; I'm not gonna sentence
6 you today. You've heard what the recommendation
7 of the Solicitor is: 15 years suspended to active
8 time of 12 years and followed by 5 years
9 probation. And that provided you, upon your
10 release, that you stay out of trouble and you show
11 back up for sentencing on January 22nd, that that
12 will continue to be the State's recommendation.
13 But if you don't show up on January 22nd or if
14 between today and January 22nd you get arrested on
15 further charges, then the State can change that
16 recommendation. And you understand that?

17 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

18 THE COURT: And you've had a chance to
19 discuss this with your attorney?

20 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

21 THE COURT: Has he answered all of
22 your questions for you?

23 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

24 THE COURT: And so is that what you
25 want to do today is plead guilty to these charges?

1 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

2 THE COURT: Are you under the
3 influence of any drugs or alcohol today?

4 THE DEFENDANT: No, ma'am.

5 THE COURT: Are you under the
6 influence of anything that's gonna keep you from
7 making a good decision today?

8 THE DEFENDANT: No, ma'am.

9 THE COURT: Has anyone promised you
10 anything other than what we've just put on the
11 record to try to get you to plead guilty?

12 THE DEFENDANT: No, ma'am.

13 THE COURT: Has anyone forced,
14 threatened, or coerced you in any way to try to
15 get you to plead guilty?

16 THE DEFENDANT: No, ma'am.

17 THE COURT: These have all been
18 indicted?

19 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, ma'am.

20 THE COURT: Do you understand that
21 you're waiving some constitutional rights today
22 when you enter this guilty plea?

23 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

24 THE COURT: You're waiving your right
25 to remain silent. You have a constitutional right

1 to remain silent which means that if you went
2 forward with a jury trial the State could not
3 force you to testify; and if you decided you did
4 not want to testify, then I would tell the jury
5 they cannot hold that against you. They can't
6 even discuss it in their deliberations because
7 it's a constitutional right. But when you plead
8 guilty you're waiving that right. And do you know
9 that?

10 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

11 THE COURT: You're also waiving your
12 right to a jury trial where 12 citizens would come
13 into court and they would hear the evidence
14 against you and they would decide whether you're
15 guilty or not guilty. But of course, you waive
16 that right when you enter a guilty plea, and you
17 know that?

18 THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

19 MR. ROBINSON: Make sure you answer
20 out loud.

21 THE COURT: Ms. Frances is taking down
22 everything that we say so I can see that you're
23 responding with a head nod, but she can't hear
24 that.

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

1 THE COURT: Thank you. At a trial,
2 again, the State would have to prove you guilty
3 beyond a reasonable doubt and all 12 jurors would
4 have to agree before you could be convicted, but
5 you're waiving that right today; is that right?

6 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

7 THE COURT: If you went forward with a
8 trial your attorney could cross-examine each of
9 the witnesses for the State. He could present any
10 defense that you might have to the charges and he
11 could subpoena witnesses to come to court to
12 testify for you; but when you enter a guilty plea,
13 you're waiving those rights as well. And do you
14 know that?

15 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

16 THE COURT: Have you had — do you
17 know what evidence the State would use against you
18 if you went forward with a trial?

19 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

20 THE COURT: And have you discussed
21 that with your attorney, the State's evidence in
22 this case?

23 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

24 THE COURT: And knowing your rights,
25 Mr. McFadden, are you pleading guilty or not

1 guilty to these charges?

2 THE DEFENDANT: Guilty.

3 THE COURT: Okay. I'm gonna hear the
4 facts from Mr. Durant and then I'm gonna have a
5 few questions for you.

6 MR. DURANT: Your Honor, as to
7 indictment 2018-151, that arose out of a
8 controlled drug buy conducted by the Clarendon
9 County narcotics task force back on March 16th of
10 2017 at the Davis Station car wash in, here in
11 Clarendon County. Undercover informant working
12 with the Sheriff's Office purchased 60-dollars
13 worth of crack cocaine from Mr. McFadden on that
14 date and that crack cocaine was tested and was,
15 came back positive for cocaine base. The next
16 incident happened on March the 31st of 2017. That
17 also arose out of a controlled drug buy conducted
18 by the Clarendon County narcotics task force.
19 That buy was off of Ferris Road in the Davis
20 Station community of Clarendon County. Undercover
21 informant purchased an amount of crack cocaine
22 from Mr. McFadden again, which was analyzed and
23 came back positive for crack cocaine.

24 Indictment 2018-153, that's the charge
25 of possession with intent to distribute crack

1 cocaine. That arose out of a traffic stop
2 conducted by South Carolina Highway Patrol off of
3 Moses Dingle and Wash Davis Road here in Clarendon
4 County. The officer stopped a vehicle being
5 driven by Mr. McFadden for a seatbelt violation.
6 When the officer approached he smelled marijuana
7 coming from the vehicle, asked Mr. McFadden and
8 the passengers out to search it, and found over
9 2-grams of crack cocaine inside the vehicle, along
10 with digital scales.

11 THE COURT: And has that been tested?

12 MR. DURANT: That has been tested as
13 well, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. McFadden, you
15 heard the facts, sir. Are those facts true?

16 MR. DURANT: Your Honor, if I may,
17 there are several other arrests as well.

18 THE COURT: I'm sorry, I thought you
19 were done.

20 MR. DURANT: I'm sorry, Your Honor.
21 Indictment 2018-154, that was another controlled
22 drug buy conducted by the Clarendon County
23 narcotics task force. That was off of Challenger
24 Court in the Summerton section of Clarendon
25 County. An undercover informant purchased

1 60-dollars worth of cocaine base from Mr.
2 McFadden. It was analyzed and tested positive.
3 The next incident occurred back on June 13th of
4 2017. That's another controlled drug buy here in
5 Clarendon County. That buy was from Mr. McFadden
6 off of Guess Road in the Pinewood section of
7 Clarendon County, and the undercover informant
8 purchased 100-dollars worth of crack cocaine from
9 Mr. McFadden. It was analyzed and tested
10 positive.

11 The next incident was in August 17th
12 of 2017, another controlled drug buy here in
13 Clarendon County off of Oak Road, Oak Grove Church
14 Road in Manning at Scott's Fast Break. An
15 undercover informant purchased 100-dollars worth
16 of crack cocaine from Mr. McFadden on that date.
17 That tested positive as well. And finally, on
18 August 29th of 2017, another controlled drug buy.
19 Another undercover informant purchased crack
20 cocaine from Mr. McFadden off of Guess Road and
21 Pinewood again, and that was analyzed and tested
22 positive for cocaine base as well.

23 THE COURT: All right, Mr. McFadden,
24 you've heard the facts, sir. Are those facts
25 true?

1 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

2 THE COURT: Okay. I do find that
3 there's a sufficient factual basis for you to
4 enter this guilty plea today and find that you're
5 entering that plea freely and voluntarily with the
6 advice of competent attorney who you tell me
7 you're pleased with, so I'll be glad to accept
8 your plea. And I'm glad to hear from you since
9 we're not sentencing, there's ---

10 MR. ROBINSON: And I would honestly,
11 Judge, just basically parrot what I said about Mr.
12 Eppes. It's the same type of situation.
13 Mr. McFadden has some prior involvement with law
14 enforcement and was facing more than first offense
15 charges in these matters, and the State agreed to
16 reduce them all to first offense charges. And I
17 explained to Mr. McFadden, based on the math I did
18 on these seven charges that he's pleading to, he's
19 looking at a potential 105 years in prison and
20 that was with what would be available to Judge
21 Cothran in January if he does not return; or if he
22 does -- as Captain Kennedy said -- gets in anymore
23 trouble or does anything, you know, out of the way
24 during the time that he's out basically for
25 Christmas. That was a very generous offer from

1 the State. Mr. McFadden is appreciative of that,
2 Your Honor, and I just wanted to thank them on the
3 record for that.

4 THE COURT: Mr. McFadden, you have a
5 lot at stake. You need to make sure you're here
6 on January 22nd.

7 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

8 THE COURT: So I would not venture too
9 far away. You know, if you're out of town and
10 your car breaks down and you're not here on
11 January 22nd or you hit some other kind of snag,
12 you're creating just a nightmare for yourself.
13 Make sure you're back here and stay out of
14 trouble. I don't know what to tell you. You need
15 to avoid anybody who's gonna drag you down with
16 them between now and January 22nd.

17 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

18 THE COURT: Good luck to you.

1 MR. DURANT: May it please the Court.

2 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

3 MR. DURANT: Your Honor, we're on the
4 record with State v. Joe Tajharey Natron McFadden.
5 He pled guilty also back in December before Judge
6 Curtis on seven indictments. Indictment
7 2018-GS-14-151 through 157 was six counts of
8 distribution of crack cocaine and one count of
9 possession with intent to distribute crack
10 cocaine. He's originally charged with third
11 offense on all counts. We allowed him to plead
12 guilty to the lesser included offense, a first
13 offense with a recommendation of a 15 year
14 sentence suspended to 12 years of active time,
15 followed by 5 years probation. That was to run
16 concurrent on all charges. Mr. McFadden's deal
17 was the same as this gentleman that pled before
18 Your Honor, sentenced before Your Honor just a few
19 minutes ago. He was explained clearly on the
20 record that he was -- well, he -- Mr. McFadden was
21 in jail, was being held without bond. He was
22 allowed to bond out and leave and go home for the
23 holidays. He was supposed to report back actually
24 at 9 a.m. this morning for sentencing. I believe
25 that was explained to him very clearly on the

1 record that he had to be here at 9 a.m. for
2 sentencing; and that in the event that he showed
3 up and was of good behavior during that interim
4 period, then the State would request that the
5 recommended sentence as was given and explained to
6 Mr. McFadden back in December be enacted. It was
7 clearly explained that in the event that he did
8 not show up, that the recommendation will be off
9 the table and Your Honor would be able to sentence
10 the defendant Mr. McFadden in your discretion.

11 THE COURT: Okay. Is that your
12 understanding, Mr. Robinson?

13 MR. ROBINSON: That was, in fact, my
14 understanding, Your Honor. I don't know what Your
15 Honor is prepared to do; but I would request that
16 perhaps at least rather than sentencing today,
17 that Your Honor issue a bench warrant and withhold
18 sentencing at least for the week and see if he can
19 be picked up and see if there's some mitigating
20 circumstances or have him a chance to be here
21 before you sentence him without his presence, Your
22 Honor. I don't dispute anything that Mr. Durant
23 said. That was, in fact, my understanding of the
24 agreement. I have talked to a close friend of
25 Mr. McFadden's and asked him to get in touch with

1 me. I've talked to the mother of one of his
2 children several times today, both of whom
3 indicated they had talked to Mr. McFadden. And
4 Mr. McFadden called me at approximately 11:15 or
5 11:20 a.m. this morning, told me he was in
6 Charleston. He misunderstood what time he was
7 supposed to be here, but he was headed this way;
8 but I have neither seen, nor heard from him since
9 that time. I have spoken again since that time to
10 the mother of one of his children and the close
11 friend of his and asked both of them again to
12 contact him, get in touch with me. I texted him
13 on his mother's cell phone from which he called me
14 this morning, left a voice mail on that cell
15 phone, called it again earlier, and didn't text or
16 leave a voice mail 'cause I was in a hurry to get
17 back in here. His, the mother of his child called
18 me about ten minutes ago and told me that she had
19 just spoken with him and that he was supposed to
20 be on the way, to try to call him again. I did,
21 left a message and texted, and that's been about
22 eight minutes ago and I have not heard back from
23 him. But my request will be that perhaps you
24 issue a bench warrant and don't sentence until
25 perhaps Friday.

1 THE COURT: Okay. And I deny your
2 request. I'm gonna sentence him. If he's picked
3 up in the next ten days or comes in in ten days,
4 you can make a motion that I can reconsider his
5 sentence. Right now I'm gonna sentence him, seal
6 the sentence, and issue a bench warrant. And then
7 if there is any mitigating circumstances, the
8 reason he wasn't here, -- i.e., he was in the
9 emergency room somewhere -- then we, I'll revisit
10 the sentence.

11 MR. DURANT: Your Honor, would you
12 like me to give you his criminal record?

13 THE COURT: Yeah.

14 MR. DURANT: Judge, he had a -- it
15 looks like a simple possession of marijuana in
16 '08, another count of simple possession of
17 marijuana in 2009. He was arrested back in 2010
18 for several counts of distribution of crack
19 cocaine with dif-- separate offense dates for the
20 year in 2009 and then arrested again in July 2010
21 for a trafficking crack cocaine. Pled guilty to
22 all those charges at one time. Back in October of
23 2010 he pled to three counts of distribution of
24 crack cocaine, three counts of proximity. And
25 that, a trafficking in crack cocaine he got a five

1 year concurrent sentence on all charges and so we
2 would -- the State will take the position that
3 those were separate offenses for enhancement
4 purposes which would make him a third offense on
5 these charges. He also had a resisting arrest
6 from back in 2015, a petit larceny two thousand--
7 I'm sorry, resisting arrest 2014 and a petit
8 larceny from 2014, a giving false information from
9 2015. And that appears to be the extent of it,
10 Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: Okay, Ms. Beulah. I'm
12 sealing this sentence. I'll ask them to pick him
13 up.

1 MS. TIMMONS: Yes, Your Honor. The
2 next matter is State of South Carolina versus Joe
3 McFadden. He pled guilty back on January 22nd of
4 2019 in front of Judge Cothran. He pled guilty to
5 seven counts of distribution of cocaine base,
6 second offense. Your Honor, Solicitor Chris
7 Durant handled that case at that time. He's no
8 longer with our office, but I guess Judge Cothran
9 sentenced him and we're here to unseal the
10 sentence.

11 THE COURT: Was that a plea?

12 MS. TIMMONS: Yes, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: Why was it sealed?

14 MR. ROBINSON: Judge, well, I will
15 explain it to you. It was a delayed imposition
16 situation where he pled -- I think he actually
17 pled in December in front of Judge Curtis and was
18 supposed to report back in January to Judge
19 Cothran for sentencing. Much like we did with
20 Mr. Wheeler, if he showed up he got the benefit of
21 a negotiated sentence. If he did not show up, it
22 was in the judge's discretion, him to sentence him
23 to whatever he felt appropriate. Mr. McFadden was
24 not present when the case was called and so he was
25 sentenced in his absence by Judge Cothran, and the

1 sentence was sealed at that time because
2 Mr. McFadden was not present.

3 THE COURT: Who was the plea in front
4 of?

5 MR. ROBINSON: It was the plea -- the
6 initial guilty plea was done in front of Judge
7 Curtis, and the sentencing was done by Judge
8 Cothran because he did not come back when he
9 promised he was going to come back.

10 THE COURT: Okay.

11 MR. ROBINSON: And so because he was
12 not here to have sentence imposed upon him, that's
13 why it was done in a sealed sentence.

14 THE COURT: So you want to unseal it
15 and unseal everything.

16 MR. ROBINSON: Well, I don't really
17 want to, but I think that's kind of what's gonna
18 happen.

19 THE COURT: My goodness, there are
20 several things in here.

21 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, sir.

22 THE COURT: One, two, three, four,
23 five, six, seven sentencing sheets. All right, on
24 indictment 2018-151, the sentence of the Court
25 according to Judge -- y'all explain this to me.

1 Maybe I need to be educated. So the plea is in
2 front of one judge and he's sentenced by another
3 one?

4 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, sir.

5 THE COURT: Sounds a little unusual to
6 me, but I guess you can do it; they did it. All
7 right. Sentence -- all right, the plea was taken
8 before Judge Curtis. Judge Cothran has sentenced
9 him on this indictment to 15 years and a
10 25,000-dollar fine, concurrent. 18-152, State
11 Department of Corrections for 15 years straight,
12 no time, concurrent. On 18-153, 15 years straight
13 time concurrent. 18-155, 15 years straight time
14 concurrent. 18-154, 15 years straight time
15 concurrent; 18-156, 15 years straight time
16 concurrent. And 18-157, that's the distribution
17 of cocaine base, 5 years straight time concurrent.
18 And that is it.

19 MR. ROBINSON: Your Honor, I know
20 you're gonna hand those back. If I could look at
21 them and just, for the record, Your Honor, rather
22 than making any motions in front of Your Honor
23 because I know all you've done is unsealed the
24 sentence, I would ask the Court to allow me to
25 reserve my right. I will file a written motion in

1 ten days to address any motions with Judge Cothran
2 when he's here in August since he's the one that
3 imposed the sentence. I just wanted to put that
4 on the record that I wasn't ---

5 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

6 MR. ROBINSON: ---not doing it.

7 THE COURT: Yes, sir, I understand.

8 Ms. Timmons, anything else, ma'am?

9 MS. TIMMONS: No, sir, Your Honor.

10 THE COURT: There we go.

11 MR. ROBINSON: You have a question?

12 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

13 MR. ROBINSON: Judge, I think

14 Mr. McFadden has a question that he wants to
15 address the Court.

16 THE COURT: Sure.

17 MR. ROBINSON: I don't know what it
18 is.

19 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir. I was
20 promised some things. That's what ---

21 THE COURT: I don't know what you were
22 promised. I've never seen the case before.
23 That's why I'm puzzled about how one can do
24 something that somebody else started, but that's
25 not my business. I just do as I'm told.

1 Mr. Robinson can answer that better than me, tell
2 you what to do, sir.

3 Don't you agree, Mr. Robinson?

4 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, sir. I just
5 wanted to, I didn't want to deny him the
6 opportunity to ---

7 THE COURT: I understand.

8 MR. ROBINSON: ---say something.

9 THE COURT: Mr. McFadden, I can't, I'm
10 not here to deal with whoever promised you
11 something that didn't happen. All I can do today
12 is read the sentence. You understand?

13 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

14 THE COURT: Okay. I'm not trying to
15 be mean, but. You were actually sentenced by
16 another judge, not by me.

17 MR. ROBINSON: You're gonna wait to
18 make the motion in front of Judge Cothran. I
19 can't stop them from unsealing the sentence. They
20 do that when they want to. So that part, I can't
21 control when they do that.

1 MR. ROBINSON: And Your Honor, this is
2 State of South Carolina versus Joe Tajharey Natron
3 McFadden, indictment number 2018-GS-14-152,
4 155, 156, 157, 1-- I'm sorry, they're a little bit
5 out of order -- 153, 154, and 151. I think it is
6 seven counts of distribution of cocaine base first
7 offense and a possession with intent to
8 distribute. Indictment number 2018-GS-14-0153 is
9 a possession with intent to distribute cocaine
10 base. And Your Honor sentenced Mr. McFadden in a
11 sealed sentence on -- I can't honestly read your
12 handwriting. 1/22/2019. Judge Curtis -- just for
13 the record, Your Honor -- Judge Curtis accepted
14 Mr. McFadden's guilty plea on December 19th, 2018,
15 but deferred sentencing until 1/22 of 2019 and
16 provided that the defendant may be released
17 pending sentencing. The understanding with the
18 State at that time was that Mr. McFadden would
19 receive a 15 year suspended to 12 year sentence
20 followed by some probation if he reported back to
21 court on January the 22nd. Mr. McFadden did not
22 report back on January the 22nd and Your Honor
23 sentenced him and sealed those sentences. Those
24 sentences were opened and placed on the record by
25 Judge McFaddin -- it looks like June 20th of

1 2019 -- and Mr. Joe McFadden received 15 years
2 concurrent on each count of distribution and
3 proximity, save and except indictment number
4 2018-GS-14-0157. He was given a five year
5 consecutive sentence on that count of
6 distribution. So in essence, Mr. McFadden
7 received a 15 year sentence followed by one 5 year
8 consecutive sentence, and Mr. McFadden has asked
9 for a reconsideration of that sentence. I did ask
10 Judge McFadden when he read that to allow me to
11 reserve the right to make that motion in front of
12 Your Honor since you were the sentencing judge.

13 Your Honor, I think you were also
14 privy to some conversation about Mr. McFadden's
15 assistance on an investigation since the plea was
16 entered that he did, in fact, give what turned out
17 to be truthful information. I'm not sure, quite
18 frankly, how much the State was able to use that
19 information; but that he did to the best of his
20 ability, give them the information that he knew.
21 That information panned out to be true. But I'm
22 not sure, again, based on that case because I'm
23 not familiar with the details of that case whether
24 or not he was supposed -- whether or not they were
25 able to use that information to solve that case or

1 to prosecute that case, but he did assist the
2 State as best he could and provide them
3 information that they did verify was truthful and
4 accurate.

5 Based upon that, Your Honor, we would
6 ask the Court to consider a reduction in your
7 original sentence, perhaps down to a ten year
8 sentence on everything, concurrent. I understand
9 Mr. McFadden has a prior record and that, you
10 know, he did have multiple offenses in this case,
11 Your Honor; but he did live up to that bargain
12 with the State and tried to fulfill his end of it
13 and that obviously was not taken into account
14 because I don't think Your Honor had that
15 information on January the 22nd when you sentenced
16 him so. Based upon that, Mr. McFadden would like
17 to ask Your Honor to reduce the sentences to ten
18 years concurrent on each one. And I don't know
19 ---

20 THE COURT: My understanding was that
21 the original sentence that Judge Curtis took, the
22 reason the State made the recommendation as 12
23 years because of the fact that he had cooperated
24 and that was why he got that deal 'cause it was
25 gonna be a second or third offense; wasn't it?

1 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.

2 MR. ROBINSON: Honestly, Judge, that
3 is not my understanding. That, the original
4 sentence was a negotiation -- and I don't know if
5 it was negotiated or recommended, whatever.

6 THE COURT: It wasn't checked on the
7 sentencing sheet.

8 MR. ROBINSON: It was a
9 recommendation.

10 THE COURT: It wasn't checked on the
11 sheet.

12 MR. ROBINSON: Recommendation.

13 THE COURT: Okay.

14 MR. ROBINSON: But honestly, at that
15 point in time as well, Your Honor, the information
16 that I'm talking about had not, that discussion
17 had not taken place. So the original, the

2 he was out between the acceptance ---

3 THE COURT: How come he didn't show
4 back up?

5 MR. ROBINSON: Well, that I cannot
6 answer, Judge.

7 THE DEFENDANT: They were making me
8 promises saying that if I wasn't setting somebody
9 up, then Mr. Mack Kennedy first. Then when I told
10 him some information, he told the lady what I said
11 so then they were labeling me as a snitch so then
12 I didn't want to talk no more so that's when I,
13 when I got locked up that's when I talked to Ken
14 Clarke, investigator, about the murder situation
15 and then that's when he said he was gonna talk to
16 somebody about helping me.

6 I got locked up, Officer Kenneth Clarke came to me
7 and told me that to talk to him, that I could

11 took a lie detector test, yes, sir.

12 MR. ROBINSON: He talked to Kenneth
13 Clarke, and Your Honor, I guess this is hearsay,

19 other source. But I'm not sure how, because I'm
20 not intimately familiar with that investigation
