ORDER

In this post-conviction relief (PCR) matter, petitioner seeks a writ of certiorari to review the decision of the Court of Appeals dated November 5, 2020, denying his petition for a writ of certiorari.¹

In *Ellison v. State*, 382 S.C. 189, 676 S.E.2d 671 (2009), this Court determined that it will no longer entertain petitions for writs of certiorari where the Court of Appeals has denied a petition for a writ of certiorari in a PCR case. Furthermore, when no petition for rehearing or reinstatement was received, the Court of Appeals sent the remittitur on December 8, 2020. *See* Rule 221, SCACR. The sending of the remittitur ended appellate jurisdiction over this case, and no further motion or petition can be considered. *Stogsdill v. S.C. Dep't of Health & Human Servs.*, 415 S.C. 568, 784 S.E.2d 669 (2016); *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). Accordingly, the petition for a writ of certiorari is dismissed.
