DESIGNATION OF MATTER


Respondent, through its undersigned attorney, would respectfully show as follows:

3. The undersigned consulted with counsel for the Appellant by email for his consent to the requested relief, and she is authorized to advise the Court that counsel consents to the requested relief.


Based on the foregoing, Respondent respectfully request this Court hold this matter in abeyance pending a resolution of this motion, and grant the Respondent the requested relief.
