MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Tashon Hurell respectfully requests a **final thirty (30) day extension, until April 9, 2021**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel two previous extensions.

Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Willie Williams v. The State of South Carolina with this Court on January 22, 2021. 4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Opposing counsel, the Attorney General's Office, has graciously consented to this extension request by way of the thirty day general consent granted by Deputy Attorney General

Donald J. Zelenka for all Appellate Defense extensions through March 31, 2021. That emailed general consent was dated February 25, 2021.


