ORDER

Appellant has served and filed a notice of appeal from an interlocutory order denying a motion for release. Because Appellant has not yet been convicted and sentenced, this appeal is dismissed.¹ *See State v. Miller*, 289 S.C. 426, 346 S.E.2d 705 (1986) (providing a criminal defendant may not appeal until sentence is imposed); *Parsons v. State*, 289 S.C. 542, 347 S.E.2d 504 (1986) (providing that the denial of bail pending trial is not immediately appealable). The remittitur will be sent as required by Rule 221, SCACR.
