With that being said I submit my Brief and Record of appeal along with my Initial Reply and this letter/statement as the avenue I best know how to use on my quest for relief.


I contend that your honor did abuse his discretion by not granting my motion for a new trial because the evidence presented at the hearing did prove a miscarriage of justice warranting relief.

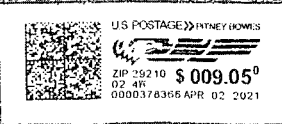
