## ORDER

Petitioner moves for an extension of time to file an initial brief to review the decision of the South Carolina Court of Appeals dismissing her appeal. This motion is construed as a motion for an extension of time to serve and file a petition for a writ of certiorari pursuant to Rule 242 of the South Carolina Court Rules (SCACR).<sup>1</sup> The request for an extension of time to serve and file the petition for writ of certiorari is granted and the time to serve and file the petition is extended until May 3, 2021. Please refer to the order of the Supreme Court of South Carolina dated July 16, 2014 (<http://www.sccourts.org/whatsnew/displaywhatsnew.cfm?indexID=963>), which provides that "[u]pon a showing of good cause, a party (or multiple parties if represented by the same counsel) may be granted extensions totaling no more than twenty (20) days," regarding any further extension requests in this matter.
