This office is in receipt of a petition for a writ of certiorari and a motion for leave to proceed in forma pauperis dated June 11, 2021, and received by this Court on June 16, 2021, wherein you appear to be challenging the decision of the Court of Appeals dismissing your appeal.¹ These documents are captioned as being filed in the Supreme Court of the United States, and not the Supreme Court of South Carolina, and there is no indication from these documents that you intend to seek relief with this Court.

Accordingly, you are advised that no action will be taken with respect to this petition and motion.

In the event you intend seek relief before this Court, you must file a petition and motion that comply with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). The SCACR are available online at <https://www.sccourts.org/courtReg/>.

Any petition for a writ of certiorari must meet the requirements of Rule 242(d), SCACR, and be served on opposing counsel and filed with proof of service with the Clerk of the Court of Appeals and the Clerk of the Supreme Court. Example forms are available at <https://www.sccourts.org/forms/> under the "appellate" forms section. Under the Supreme Court's order titled "*RE: Operation of the Appellate Courts During the Coronavirus Emergency (As Amended May 29, 2020)*,"² you are not required to file an appendix, and you are not required to file additional copies of your petition or other documents.

Further, any motion to proceed in forma pauperis must meet the requirements of Rule 240, SCACR.
