on or about June 05 1999 petitioner then a child of 14 yrs old was detained in Orangeburg SC. at this time petitioner had never been to Orangeburg SC. had no relatives or legal guardian in Orangeburg SC. Furthermore petitioner legal guardian was petitioner's mother Beatrice Thompson who lived in West Columbia SC. at this time.

Lawful Command: A child cannot be considered incorrigible if the orders the adult gives are illegal, for example like the child being forced to commit a crime, which in fact petitioner had informed the authorities of.

petitioner was released from his detainment the next day by the same Orangeburg authorities, who told petitioner they was keeping there promise since petitioner did everything they asked him. Petitioner was set free on his own accord, NOT released to his parents, NOT to DSS, or any adult custody, this was June 06 1999 in Orangeburg SC. Petitioner was then a child of 14 yrs old.

Petitioner was not served with an arrest warrant or indictment, was not arraigned on the charge I was convicted for. Petitioner never had an attorney, so how can the plea petitioner made be voluntarily and knowingly, based on Boykin v. Alabama, 395 U.S. 238 (1966) Also quoting State v. Hazel, 275 S.C. 392 (1980) (He must also have an understanding of the charges against him.) In a criminal case, the defendant has the right to be fully informed of the nature and cause of the accusation against him. S.C. Const. art. I § 14. The right to be fully informed is a personal right and therefore the defendant himself, not just his attorney must be fully informed of the charges against him.

State v. Green, 269 S.C. 657 (1977) in Green, the defendant was not served with an arrest warrant, or indictment, was not arraigned, and was never informed of the charges against him.

The sixth Amendment to the United States Constitution provides that in all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right... to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusations and to be confronted

with the witnesses against him, which is made applicable to the state prosecutions under the Fourteenth Amendment. Pointer v. Texas, 380 U.S. 400, 85 S. Ct. 1065, 13 L. Ed. (2d) 923 (1967)

These rights are personal to the accused. "It is the accused, not counsel, who must be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation, who must be confronted with the witnesses against him," Faretta v. California, 422 U.S. 806, 820, 95 S. Ct. 2525, 2533, 45 L. Ed. (2d) 562 (1975).

Petitioner a child of 16yrs old from west Columbia SC is detained in Orangeburg SC with visible glass sticking from the palms of both hands and bleeding. Told the authorities petitioner was forced to participate in a crime and fell as he was entering the building. Petitioner gave authorities several guns that petitioner was forced to take from the shop. The first chance petitioner got he ran away from these older males. Petitioner was promised, friendship, safety, food, and freedom if he just continued to cooperate, which petitioner did.

Title 17- Criminal Procedures

Chapter 15

Bail and Recognizance

Section 17-15-10. Person charged with noncapital offense may be released on his own recognizance; conditions of release; bond hearing for burglary charges.

(A) A person charged with a noncapital offense triable in either the magistrates, county or circuit courts, be ordered released pending trial on his own recognizance without any surety.

Section 17-15-20. Conditions of appearance recognizance or appearance bond; discharge, validity, relief of surety. (A) An appearance recognizance or appearance bond must be conditioned on the persons charged personally appearing before the court specified to answer the charge or indictment and to do and receive what is enjoined by the court, and not to leave the state, and be of good behavior towards all citizens of the state, or especially towards a person or persons specified by the courts.

Petitioner was never released by any court. Petitioner was released by the Orangeburg authorities that had detained petitioner, petitioner's parents, DSS was not contacted, in fact petitioner was in custody of Orangeburg authorities for over 24hrs. ample time to notify petitioner's parent, DSS, or attorney.

Petitioner was told by Orangeburg authorities that he couldn't be transported to his home in West Columbia SC. because A was out of their jurisdiction, they informed petitioner to follow the road in front of the Sheriff complex to the interstate where petitioner could possibly catch a ride back to West Columbia

South Carolina Statute 63-5-70 Unlawful Conduct towards a Child; (A) It is unlawful for a person who has charge or custody of a child, or who is responsible for the welfare of a child as defined in section 63-7-20: (1) Place the child at unreasonable risk of harm affecting the child's life, physical or mental health, or safety; (2) do or cause to be done unlawfully or maliciously any bodily harm to the child, so that the life or health of the child is endangered or likely to

to be endangered; or (3) willfully abandon the child.

(3) A person who violates subsection (A) is guilty of a felony and for each offense, upon conviction, must be fined in the discretion of the court or imprisoned not more than ten years or both.

Orangeburg authorities became petitioner's lawful guardian on June 05 1999 because petitioner was then 11 yrs old which by statute was legally a child. Petitioner was detained by Orangeburg authorities after petitioner ran away from several adult males who just committed a successful violent criminal act, which petitioner was forced to commit.

At no time did petitioner think he was in trouble for committing a violent criminal act. Furthermore what authorities in America will release a 11yr old child who just committed a violent criminal act with several adult males who got away with several guns and hide their identities by wearing mask.

petitioner a 16yr old child who is from several countries over has never been to Orangeburg, has no money, visible injuries, and parents or DSS has not been contacted, was told to walk home by way of interstate. This constitutes a violation of Statute 63-5-70. Unlawful Conduct towards a child (1)(2)(3).

Petitioner was detained at 17yrs old in Columbia SC. for a General Sessions bench warrant. Orangeburg County transported petitioner to Orangeburg County Detention Center. Petitioner was summoned to General Session Court Dec. 7 2000. Petitioner was approached by a white female petitioner had never meet before, this female wore a short mini skirt, petitioner never even knew her name. This female asked petitioner was ready to go home petitioner stated yes. She asked petitioner to sign something and come sit off to the side in private with her so she could inform petitioner how he is to respond to the judge, she told me exactly how the judge would question me and how petitioner was to answer each question, and if he didn't know how to respond to look at her for guidance. She would instruct petitioner with a head movement.

petitioner plead to 2nd degree burglary non-violent, petitioner was arrested for 2nd degree burglary in violation of SC Statute 20-7-2605 (4) because petitioner never received a Juvenile waiver hearing in accordance of the law.

Counsel M advised petitioner to waive his rights and plead guilty, Counsel whom petitioner has never meet before, whom petitioner doesn't even know name, advised petitioner he was pleading under the youthful offender act and once petitioner completed the sentence it would be off petitioner record, that if petitioner plead guilty he could get released from being confined in the Orangeburg County Jail for a yrs

This the only time petitioner ever talked to any attorney in relations to his conviction. Petitioner was detained at 17 yrs old for a General Sessions bench warrant, and was held until Dec. 2000 in the Orangeburg Detention Center. After petitioner plead guilty, he was told his case was getting transferred to Lexington County Probation, Parole, and Pardon Service. Counsel never went over anything with petitioner, not even the fact petitioner could appeal.

Although petitioner has never raised this issue other than now a defendant may for the first time on appeal raise the issue of the trial courts jurisdiction to try the class of case of which the defendant was convicted. As stated in State v Faley, 43 SE. 52, 59-60, 20 SE 298, 801 (1895) overruled on other grounds by State v. Torrence, 305 SE. 45, 406 SE. 2d 315 (1991) Citations omitted]

Petitioner's claims are not time barred because petitioner has demonstrated actual innocence of the substantive offense. Quoting Murray v Carrier, 477 US 478, 496 petitioner's indictment allege petitioner willfully and lawfully entered woody's Pawn Shop on June 05 1999, that is not true, petitioner was forced to enter woody's Pawn Shop to commit a crime on June 05 1999, by adult males when he was 16 yrs old.

This court can attest from the record petitioner was released on his own recognizance at 16 yrs old by Orangeburg law enforcement officers less than 48 hrs after petitioner has been detained in connection to a

Violent Criminal act far away from home. This court can attest petitioner was indeed innocent of a violent Criminal act, that petitioner was not delinquent, Petitioner's Parents were never notified. Petitioner was told to walk home, and showed the way to walk home freely at his own accord by Orangeburg authorities, Petitioner walked, hitched hiked, and borrowed a bike to get back to west Columbia SC., because petitioner was refused transportation by Orangeburg authorities.

United States v Ricks, 575 F.3d 198, 202 (4th Cir 2009)
To show duress: (1) that he was subjected to an unlawful and present threat of death or serious bodily injury at the time that the crime happened; (2) that he did not recklessly place himself in a situation where he would be forced to engage in the Criminal act; (3) that he had no reasonable legal alternative to either the Criminal act or the avoidance of the threatened harm; and (4) that there was a direct causal relationship between the Criminal act and the avoidance of the threatened harm.

In the present case petitioner was with a group of adult males who petitioner got into a burgundy Chevy model car with in west Columbia SC with to go to a graduation party with, Petitioner knew one of these males Johnny Dickson, this was on June 04 1999.

At the party petitioner drank alot of alcohol and ended up getting into the car to sleep. Petitioner was woken up in the early morning hrs of June 05 1999 in the company of the adult males one of whom is Johnny Dickson, who is in the back seat with petitioner.

The two adult males who were in the front seats were trying to tell petitioner to take off his Black T-shirt and put on a white T-shirt, petitioner refused, they told petitioner they was going to kill him and nobody would know. Petitioner was scared so he participated under duress in this crime.

They ordered petitioner to change shirts, petitioner refused, they tied there faces up and ordered Petitioner, again petitioner refused. The adult males tied t-shirts around there faces to hide there

identities, Petitioner never tied anything around his face to hide his identity, or changed to match the adult males. When the adult males pulled in front of the shop petitioner got out, but was ordered to come inside and grab guns once they drove the car through the shop, and get out to break the gun cases or else.

As petitioner entered the shop petitioner fell on all the broken glass and injured both hands, petitioner grab several guns and get inside of the car. Although all the tires on the car was flat the adult male drove to a house and pulled in the back completely hidden from the street, also the house was abandon.

Petitioner was ordered to stay close and follow the adult males, during the quick ride petitioner tied the guns in the shirt he refused to tie around his face, and instead of following the adult males as ordered, petitioner ran in an opposite direction from the adult males, hide the guns and continued walking until petitioner was detained by Orangeburg authorities.

As petitioner sat in the patrol car in the front of Woody's Pawn Shop, officers told petitioner that the owners where mad as hell and that if they let me go now, they would kill me. That these guys where bad guys, that if petitioner lied about anything they would know and they wouldn't protect me, since the Owner knew who I was, Petitioner was completely honest about the entire incident.

Petitioner has meet the 4 prong test under United States v Ricks, [Citations Omitted] to prove petitioner was under duress when he committed the offense. Since petitioner was 16yrs old at the time of the offense General Sessions Court lacked subject matter jurisdiction to accept a plea for 2nd degree burglary non-violent under State v. Slacomb, and Gentry, States, matters of subject matter jurisdiction may be raised at any time.

Petitioner seeks an order from this court declaring petitioner innocent and that petitioners 2000 conviction was the result of False imprisonment, malicious prosecution, and a miscarriage of justice.

The fourth amendment is violated whenever the police might reasonably have obtained a warrant but failed to do so. A person's mere proximity to others independently suspected of criminal activity does not, without more, give rise to probable cause search of that person, Sibron v. New York, 392 US. 40; where the standard is probable cause, a search or seizure of a person must be supported by probable cause particularized with respect to that person. This requirement cannot be undercut or avoided by simple pointing to the fact that coincidentally there exists probable cause to search or seizure or to search the premises where the person may happen to be.

ON 6/30/2011 at 9:36 Det Chappell did a field check and seen a prior burglary of a dwelling Petitioner never committed and based that as evidence to arrest. Graham v. United States, 282 US. 344, 282 US 356, 357 the first clause forbids "unreasonable searches and seizures" of persons, houses, papers, and effects. Exhibit (m)

The second clause describes the circumstances under which a search warrant or arrest warrant may issue, requiring specification of the place to be searched as well as the persons or things to be seized.

On 7/01/2011 Det Chappell received a delayed inquiry match at 4126 from Richland County for failure to appear Exhibit (O) at 4:21 7/01/2011 warrant was issued for petitioner arrest. Exhibit (P)

The Fourth Amendment directs "no warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized." Supreme Court holds invalid authority for unconstitutional searches Torres v Puerto Rico, 442 US 465; Almeida-Sanchez v. United States, 413 US 266. Sibron v New York, 392 US 40; Berger v. New York, 388 US 41; "the right of the people to be secure in their persons" against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrant shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

No evidence has been presented to warrant DET Chappell to run background checks on petitioner on 6/30/11. Although petitioner may have been a friend of Margaret Chiggers, whom DET had reason to believe was involved with a crime, mere propinquity to others suspected of criminal activity without more does not give rise to search that person, which is a violation of petitioner's fourth Amendment. "Where the standard is probable cause, a search or seizure of a person must be supported by probable cause particularized with respect to that person. This requirement cannot be undercut or avoided by simple pointing to the fact that coincidentally there exists probable cause to search or seize, or to search the premises where the person may be."

Petitioner has never lived on Dunder lane or stayed a single night at any house on Dunder lane, evidence was offered against petitioner, that was seized from Dunder lane in violation of petitioner's fourth Amendment constitutional rights, because Lexington or any other agency had any lawful duty to search petitioner in the homicide of Timothy Tice.

Statute 17-13-148. State must comply with this statute or show good faith. Exclusion is the only remedy. The Fourth Amendment to the United States Const. guarantees to individuals the right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures. One who seeks to have evidence suppressed on this basis must establish that his own Fourth Amendment rights were violated. United States v. Salvucci, 448 US 83, 100 S. Ct. 2547, 65 L. Ed. 2d 619. State v. Sach 216 SE. 2d 510. a valid search warrant properly executed, may produce evidence sufficient to convict a person accused of a crime. A defective and invalid search warrant produces confusion, waste and injustice, to an accused or society or both.

Only evidence offered was after arrest, therefore petitioner's convictions cannot stand.

ON 7-1-11 petitioner was arrested by Lexington County authorities in connection to the Homicide of Timothy Tice on Jakes Landing. Petitioner was arraigned on 7-2-11 and ordered not to contact the public defender office, that I was not eligible for indigent defense counsel. Exhibit (A) Exhibit (B)

Being locked up without counsel put me at a disadvantage, it hindered me from gathering evidence, contacting witnesses, basically preparing a defense. Petitioner was arraigned 2 additional times and at these arraignments petitioner was told he could receive counsel for his indigent status. (AA) (BB)

Petitioner requested a preliminary hearing and had one Aug. 26, 2011. Petitioner along with his appointed counsel Dean O'Neil was present. Petitioner asks for charges for 1st degree burglary and Murder to be dismissed, due to petitioner's innocence, and lack of evidence. Judge binded case over pending the outcome of DNA evidence, Officer Chappell testified to would solve case. Exhibit (C)

Nothing happened until Charles Plumley who was my cellmate for a few months until I asked him to leave from sharing a cell with me, due to his statements about him being offered a 10yr sentence to gather information for Shawn Graham to assist with prosecuting murder cases, and asking me would I be willing to cooperate.

My attorney (Dean D'Nei) assured me that after they compared all the DNA evidence in my case I would be exonerated that I didn't have anything to worry about, there was no need for him to investigate or question any witnesses on my behalf, that I couldn't get a bond and for me to just sit.

In June or July of 2012 Charles Plumley informed me he was at bond hearing with Kenneth Walters and Margaret Driggers, the other two people charged with this homicide, was in court with him and Shawn Graham was requesting bonds on their behalf, because they would be testifying against me, on behalf of the State

and also to what they would be testifying to. Charles Plumley admitted to me that him along with a court room full of civilians and detention inmates heard Shawn Graham state what these individuals would be testifying to. I then contacted my attorney and informed him of what Charles Plumley told me.

At this time a petitioner ordered Dean O'Neil to file for me a bond hearing, a fast & speedy trial motion, and a motion to prevent anybody in the county jail from testifying against me since Charles Plumley had heard details of my case in open court from Shawn Graham.

Also I informed him that Margaret Driggers and I were writing each other through Charles Plumley and his wife Angela Griffith, that I believe the Solicitors were trying to set me up. I was placed in a cell with Charles Plumley, who was allowed to write his wife, who was cellmates with Margaret Driggers, so there to elicit incriminating statements about my charges.

I received a letter from attorney Deon O'Neil indicating I would be attending a bond hearing. I was transferred along with Charles Plumley to court, where I was denied bond, but Plumley was given a bond.

At this time I notified my attorney I was displeased with his representation, because his lack of assistance. It has been over a year since I've been in World, how could I obtain witnesses in my favor or present a sufficient Alibi defense, since I was actual innocent of the crimes I was charged with.

I then attempted to file a set of motions on my behalf, but was instructed, that I was only allowed to file motions thru my court appointed attorney. After several attempts to get Deon O'Neil to file motions, get witnesses on my behalf, get DNA tested to exonerate me, and establish a record for me to prove my actual innocence.

I filed a motion to dismiss attorney pro se and in Oct. 2012 Petitioner went to court on his motion to dismiss attorney. Deon O'Neil approached petitioner, petitioner informed Deon O'Neil that he needed to inform Judge Madlock that I would like to speak with him personally, without the prosecution or public involved about my case and the reason I didn't feel comfortable with him representing me. Exhibit (4)

Deon O'Neil went and spoke with the judges clerk and came back and informed me that the judge was granting my motions, for me today that I wasn't going to have the opportunity to speak with him. Fast & speedy trial, dismiss attorney, Swidch Act US v. Henry 447 U.S. 264 (1980)

The judge also informed petitioner personally that he was granting my motions and that if my case is called Feb. 2013 and I didn't have an attorney, then I would be tasked with representing myself. He made sure I understood and advised Deon O'Neil to make sure I understood.

Exhibit (G) no white attorney would represent me for being accused of killing a white man in Lexington County SC, unless I was going to pay them thousands of dollars. The white judge didn't want to give me a lawyer, so I was given ineffective counsel.

Not only was Dean Owen ineffective I wrote the office of disciplinary counsel and received a letter from them dismissing my complaint against him Exhibit (H) Petitioner was stabbing his on records in justice, racial discrimination, and malicious prosecution.

My trial date was not honored by the state, I also have no bond, no attorney, it's march going into April. I obtain Casey Cornwell as counsel, I introduce him to my indictments #2011GS3203198 & 2011GS3203199 Exhibit (I) That I was schedule for trial Feb. 2013, and I was not going to withdraw my fast & speedy trial motion. Petitioner continued to inform Casey Cornwell that my case was very public Exhibit (K) And the Solicitor have made comments about my case in open court, He should motion to dismiss.

Petitioner continued to inform Casey Cornwell that my case was very public and racial discriminating Exhibit (K) and that Shawn Graham have made comments in open court so inmates could hear what he is trying me for, that he should motion to dismiss.

Casey Cornwell advised me that I couldn't file a motion to dismiss and the State wanted DNA from me, I explained to him the State has my DNA on record, that I've seen court ordered to give DNA because I went to prison. He said if I refused the court will order it, I told him I would rather speak with the judge because the State is buying time to solicit false witnesses.

April 2013 Petitioner went to court for the DNA hearing, Judge Newman asked Shawn Graham what would be done if the DNA was not petitioner's since it was so vital to obtain a DNA sample from petitioner, since petitioner's DNA was on record? His response was we will get to that point once we get there. Judge Newman ordered me to give up the DNA, and advised me that this very well may exonerate

me, he also ordered me tried by Aug. 2013, since I informed him that the state has not honored my motion granted for fast & speedy trial granted by Judge Madelon.

Petitioner received a letter from attorney Casey Cornwell indicating Petitioner DNA results came back negative, that petitioner was excluded from all DNA Comparison in connection to the Homicide of Timothy Tice Exhibit (L)

Petitioner was tried Nov. 2013 Charles Plumley was state's witnesses, Petitioner was found guilty and sentenced to life without parole, Charles Plumley received 10 yrs for Murder, 1st degree burglary, and Armed robbery. We were both prosecuted by the same solicitor and Judge.

Petitioner would like for this court to declare petitioner innocent, "Even when there is adequate proof of the corpus delicti of murder, that someone died by the criminal agency of another, absent evidence of guilt of the particular defendant, his conviction

cannot stand. State v. Martin, 340 S.C. 597, 533 S.E.
2d 572 (2000) [Reversing conviction for failure to grant
a directed verdict.] Accord, State v. Arnold, 361 S.C. 386
665 S.E.2d 529 (2004) [Split Court affirmed Court of appeals
finding that a direct verdict should have been granted in
a murder case placing great weight on the fact that
there was no evidence placing defendant at the scene
of the murder.]

Livingston County solicitor Rick Hubbard is liar.
Trial transcript page 88 Rick Hubbard told
Judge Russo that authorities didn't know who
I was, that Richland County gang unit was
contacted, and that the name of west was asso-
ciated with a folk name Demetrius Glenn, and
that is how they got my name.

Petitioner is not a folk or any other gang member
or associate of any folk or any other gang member.
Exhibit (N) (M) (O) (P) is a list of all petitioner
aliases. Neither the arrest warrant or search
warrant mentioned a alias of west.

Petitioner presents Exhibit (Q) witness sta-
tement of Kenneth Walters, Kenneth Walters
never ID petitioner as west, furthermore on
7-4-2011 petitioner was already in detention
charged with the homicide of Timothy Tice.

Based on this evidence the court can attest
Solicitor Rick Hubbard lied and Det. Chappell
lied to mislead Judge Russo and the Jury at

Petitioner's Nov 2013 trial. Petitioner presents

being duly sworn deposes and says that defendant Demetriss Alshawn Glenn
did within this county and state on or about 06/26/2011 violate the criminal laws of the
State of South Carolina (or ordinance of County/ Municipality of Lexington)
in the following particulars:

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENSE Murder / Murder

I further state that there is probable cause to believe that the defendant named above did commit
the crime set forth and that probable cause is based on the following facts:

That on 06-26-2011 the defendant, Demetriss Alshawn Glenn, along with two co-defendants, did with malice and aforethought kill
the victim, Timothy Tice. The defendant, along with two co-defendants went to the victim's residence located at 220 Jakes Landing
Road lot E-4 in the Lexington area of Lexington County, South Carolina. The defendant and one of the co-defendants entered the
residence without consent. Once inside the victim was struck several times in the head with a blunt object, killing him. The victim's
cell phone and wallet were missing from the residence. A witness told law enforcement that Demetriss said that he beat someone
about the head and may have killed him. A co-defendant also told law enforcement that the defendant and co-defendants went to the
victim's residence to get money and that the victim was killed in the process.

HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION

Lexington County Sheriff's Department detectives are investigating the death of a 45-year-old Lexington man who was found deceased on Sunday, June 26 at his home on Jakes Landing Road. The man died as a result of a blunt force injury to his head.

Lexington County Sheriff James R. Metts said detectives are continuing to investigate the circumstances of the death of Timothy Edward Tice, 45, of 220 Jakes Landing Road, Lot E-4, Lexington. The motive for the killing also remains under investigation.

Detectives are pursuing leads concerning the person or persons who killed Tice, Metts said. There was no indication that the person or persons who killed Tice broke into his home.

Deputies arrived at Tice's home at 11:53 a.m. on Sunday in response to a call to assist Lexington County Emergency Medical Services personnel, Metts said. Deputies found that the front door at Tice's home was open.

Deputies found Tice's body on the floor in the home's kitchen, Metts said. There was a large amount of blood on the kitchen floor.

Metts asked anyone with information about Tice or Tice's death to contact the Lexington County Sheriff's Department at (803) 785-8230 or CrimeStoppers at 1-888-CRIME-SC. Citizens also can provide information anonymously by accessing the Crime Tip link on the Sheriff's Department web site (www.lexingtonsheriff.com).

Lexington County Coroner Harry O. Harman said preliminary results of an autopsy that was performed on Monday, June 27 on the body of a 45-year-old Lexington man show that the man died as a result of a blunt force injury to his head.

A pathologist determined that Timothy Edward Tice, 45, of 220 Jakes Landing Road, Lot E-4, Lexington, died from a fractured skull that resulted from a blunt force injury to his head, Harman said. The coroner ruled that Tice's death was a homicide.

A deputy coroner went to Tice's home on Sunday, June 26 and pronounced Tice deceased shortly after arriving at the residence at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, Harman said.

Tice's death remains under investigation by the Lexington County Coroner's Office and Lexington County Sheriff's Department, Harman said.

TWO PERSONS ARRESTED ON MURDER CHARGES

Lexington County Sheriff's Department detectives have arrested a 26-year-old Columbia woman and 28-year-old West Columbia man in connection with the death of a 45-year-old man who died as a result of being hit several times on his head with a wine bottle on June 26 at his home on Jakes Landing Road near Lexington.

Lexington County Sheriff James R. Metts said detectives arrested Margaret Marie Driggers, 26, of 4533 Corbett Street, Columbia, on arrest warrants on charges of murder and misprision of a felony. Detectives arrested Demetriss Alshawn Glenn, 28, of 3118 Dudley Road, Lot 19, West Columbia, on an arrest warrant on a charge of murder.

Driggers and Glenn were being held on Saturday, July 2 at the Lexington County Detention Center while awaiting bond hearings on the murder charges, Metts said. Under South Carolina law, a circuit judge would have to conduct bond hearings for Driggers and Glenn because murder carries a punishment of life in prison. The 11th Judicial Circuit Solicitor's Office has not yet scheduled bond hearings for Driggers and Glenn on the murder charges.

Detectives are searching for a third person, who has not yet been positively identified, whom detectives think accompanied Driggers and Glenn when they fatally beat Timothy Edward Tice, 45, on June 26 at Tice's home at 220 Jakes Landing Road, Lot E-4, Lexington, Metts said.

Metts asked anyone with information concerning the identity of the third person whom detectives think was involved in Tice's murder to call the Lexington County Sheriff's Department at (803) 785-8230 or CrimeStoppers at 1-888-CRIME-SC. Citizens also can provide information anonymously by accessing the Crime Tip link on the Sheriff's Department web site (www.lexingtonsheriff.com).

Arrest warrants allege that Driggers and Glenn went to Tice's home on the morning of June 26 with the intent to rob Tice, Metts said. After Driggers and Glenn entered Tice's home, a physical struggle ensued. Tice was hit in the head several times with an Arbor Mist wine bottle. Detectives later recovered the wine bottle, which was found broken into pieces, at Tice's home.

Lexington County Coroner Harry O. Harman said preliminary results of an autopsy that was performed June 27 on Tice's body show that Tice died within minutes after suffering a fractured skull as a result of a blunt force injury to his head. A forensic pathologist determined the blunt force injury resulted when an assailant used a wine bottle to beat Tice on Tice's head.

Detectives initially arrested Driggers at 4:13 p.m. on Thursday, June 30 on an arrest warrant on a charge of misprision of a felony, Metts said. While being interviewed on Tuesday, June 28 and Wednesday, June 29, Driggers knowingly and willfully concealed the fact that she was present when Tice was killed, hindering the investigation of Tice's death. Detectives obtained an arrest warrant for Driggers on a charge of murder on Friday, July 1 and served Driggers with the arrest warrant at the Lexington County Detention Center.

Detectives obtained an arrest warrant for Glenn on a charge of murder on Friday, Metts said. Richland County Sheriff's Department deputies detained Glenn on Friday night. Lexington County Sheriff's Department detectives served Glenn with the arrest warrant and booked Glenn at the Lexington County Detention Center at 10:01 p.m. on Friday.

"I want to thank several citizens who provided detectives with information that helped them develop sufficient probable cause to obtain arrest warrants for Driggers and Glenn on a charge of murder," Metts said.

Lexington County Sheriff's Department detectives on Monday, July 4 arrested a third person in connection with the death of a 45-year-old man who died as a result of being hit several times on his head with a wine bottle on June 26 at his home on Jakes Landing Road near Lexington.

Lexington County Sheriff James R. Metts said detectives arrested Kenneth Darrell Walters, 26, of 716 Washington Street, Apartment 7, Columbia, on an arrest warrant on a charge of murder at 3:49 p.m. on Monday. Walters was being held on Tuesday, July 5 at the Lexington County Detention Center while awaiting a bond hearing on the murder charge.

Under South Carolina law, a circuit judge would have to conduct a bond hearing for Walters in general sessions court because murder carries a punishment of life in prison, Metts said. The 11th Judicial Circuit Solicitor's Office has not yet scheduled a bond hearing for Walters.

Detectives previously arrested Margaret Marie Driggers, 26, of 4533 Corbett Street, Columbia, on arrest warrants on charges of murder and misprision of a felony, Metts said. Detectives also previously arrested Demetriss Alshawn Glenn, 28, of 3118 Dudley Road, Lot 19, West Columbia, on an arrest warrant on a charge of murder.

Driggers and Glenn were being held on Tuesday at the Lexington County Detention Center while awaiting bond hearings on the murder charges, Metts said.



On July 1st, 2011 Sgt Barry Sowards along with other Lexington County Officers and Officer Drew Caldwell of the Richland County Fugitive team arrived at the residence to be searched to talk to Tyrone Williams who is the uncle of a potential suspect in this case. Upon arrival officers were invited into Mr. Williams' residence as he volunteered information about this murder. He said on June 28th, 2011 at around 2 pm he received a long gun from a guy who he knows as Shawn who is friends with his nephew Demitruis. Williams further informed Law Enforcement that he was told by Shawn that his gun is his father's gun and just wanted Williams to hold this gun which Williams found suspicious. Williams also learned details about how the victim was murdered by associates of Shawn.



The DNA profile developed from the minor contributor to this mixture is from an unidentified individual and has been entered into the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS). **Demetriss Glenn, Kenneth Walters, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to this mixture.**

The DNA profile developed from item 6.2 is a mixture of at least three individuals. The DNA profile developed from the major contributor to this mixture is attributable to Timothy Tice. The DNA profile developed from the minor contributors to this mixture is not suitable for CODIS entry. **Demetriss Glenn, Kenneth Walters, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to this mixture.**

The DNA profile developed from item 15.1 is a mixture of at least three individuals and is not suitable for CODIS entry. Timothy Tice, **Demetriss Glenn, Kenneth Walters, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to this mixture.**

The DNA profile developed from item 18 is a mixture of at least two individuals and is not suitable for CODIS entry. No conclusive statement can be made regarding the inclusion or exclusion of Timothy Tice as a possible contributor to this mixture. **Demetriss Glenn, Kenneth Walters, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to this mixture.**

RESULTS

The DNA profile developed from item 22 matches the DNA profile of Kenneth Walters. The probability of randomly selecting an unrelated individual having a DNA profile matching this item is approximately 1 in 9.6 quadrillion. Timothy Tice, Rachal Kaney, Tammy Handy, Tanya Powell, Janice Pitts, Melissa Hayes, Demetriss Glenn, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to this item.

The partial DNA profile developed from item 23 is a mixture of at least two individuals.

The partial DNA profile developed from item 24 is from an unidentified individual.

The partial DNA profile developed from item 27 is from an unidentified individual.

Timothy Tice, Rachal Kaney, Tammy Handy, Tanya Powell, Janice Pitts, Melissa Hayes, Demetriss Glenn, Kenneth Walters, and Margaret Driggers are excluded as possible contributors to items 23, 24, and 27.
