In regard to case # 2021-000533, I received your order dated 6/14/21 on 6/24/21, denying the appeal for failing to serve and file the order under appeal.

On the week of May 23rd, 2021, appellant received a notice of deficiency dated May 21st, 2021. Appellant then mailed, via U.S. post, a copy of the ALC order challenged on appeal on the same week of May 23rd, 2021.

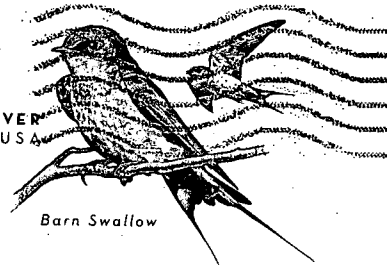
