ORDER

After the circuit court denied petitioner's motion for a new trial in this tort case, petitioner filed an appeal with the South Carolina Court of Appeals. The Court of Appeals dismissed the appeal.¹

Petitioner has now filed a petition for a writ of certiorari seeking review of the decision of the Court of Appeals, along with a motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

The motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* is denied. *Ex parte Martin*, 321 S.C. 533, 471 S.E.2d 134 (1995). If the \$250 filing fee required by Rule 242(c) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules is not paid within ten (10) days of the date of this order, the petition for a writ of certiorari will be dismissed. Until the fee is paid, the time for the respondents to serve and file any return to the petition for a writ of certiorari is held in abeyance.
