Dear Mr. Burnside:

We received your motion for extension of time to serve and file the appellant's final brief. It is not yet time to serve and file the appellant's final brief. According to Rules 210 and 211 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), the record on appeal is due to be served within thirty (30) days after service of the last brief, and the appellant's final brief is due to be served and filed within twenty (20) days after the service of the Record on Appeal.
