## ORDER

This appeal arises out of an order of the circuit court denying Appellant's motion to relieve counsel. Because the underlying order is not immediately appealable, we dismiss this appeal. *See State v. Miller*, 289 S.C. 426, 426, 346 S.E.2d 705, 705 (1986) ("In South Carolina, a criminal defendant may not appeal until sentence has been imposed."). Additionally, Appellant is represented by counsel; thus, we cannot accept his pro se filings because there is a prohibition on hybrid representation. *See State v. Devore*, 416 S.C. 115, 122, 784 S.E.2d 690, 694 (Ct. App. 2016). The remittitur will be sent pursuant to Rule 221(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.
