PETITION FOR WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS

NOW COMES: Petitioner, Theodore Bolick pro se and hereby moves the Honorable Court of Appeals for South Carolina to issue a Writ of Mandamus. In support of this Petition, the Petitioner shows as follows.

FACTS

1. On June 15, 2021 Warden, Terrie Wallace at Kirkland R#E in Columbia, S.C. took the Petitioner as a prisoner without a valid judgment or commitment. As of the date of this Petition/Application, Warden, Terrie Wallace continues to hold the Petitioner a prisoner against his will without a valid or lawful judgment or commitment order.

2. On June 22, 2021 the Petitioner pursuant South Carolina Code of Law, Title 17, Chapter 17 ET. AL. petitioned the Circuit Court for the 5th Judicial Circuit, Richland County for a Writ of habeas corpus.

3. The Richland County, Clerk of Court, Jewette McBride received said petition on June 22, 2021 and assigned it Case No. 2021 CP4003384, (Bolick V. Wallace).

4. Pursuant South Carolina Constitution Article I, Section 2 I have the right to petition the government for redress of grievances.

Pursuant South Carolina Constitution, Article I, Section 3 I have the right to due process and equal protection of law

Pursuant S.C. Const. Art. I § 9 I have a right to speedy remedy.

Pursuant S.C. Const. Art. I § 18 the Writ of habeas corpus will not be suspended except in time of war or rebellion.

Finally, South Carolina Code of Law, Title 17, Chapter 17 specifically provides the right to petition for a writ of habeas corpus. Further, South Carolina Code of Law Title 17, Chapter 17, Section 80 provides that I should have been brought before the Court within ten (10) days for a hearing on the petition for writ of habeas corpus.

5. As of August 1, 2021 the Respondent, Warden Terrie Wallace has not responded

to the Writ of Habeas Corpus, nor have I been produced before the Court.

6. Therefore, it is manifested that numerous individuals have neglected their duties as prescribed by S.C. Code of Law, Title 17, Chapter 17 et al. Further, they are subject to the sanctions called for pursuant S.C. Code of Law, Title 17, Chapter 17, Section 170.

7. That Petitioner has motioned the Circuit court for judgment asking the sanctions provided for by S.C. Code of Law, Title 17 Chapter 17, Section 170 be imposed and granted.

### CONCLUSION

Wherefore: Petitioner requests the Honorable Court of Appeals issue an Order directing the Circuit Court for the 5<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit, Richland County to hear and consider the Petitioner's Writ of habeas corpus filed June 22, 2021 and subsequent Motion for Judgment at the next

session of the Court of Common Pleas in

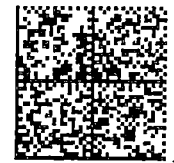
