
Appellant has proven her Case with evidence and honesty (time and time again) but feels that the Court has not considered the Merit of the Case at all. The worth or value; intrinsic rightness or wrongness, has never been heard. The Merit of the Case, as seen by Appellant, is that the actions on the part of the Respondents are harmful to others.

Appellant would like information as to why this was sent back to the Lower Court? Is it legal when, after all, the Case was Dismissed and filed with the Court of Appeals? (Even with all of the evidence presented she had hoped to win this case against men who chose money over lives (proven), so that the Court would be compensated for the Case. 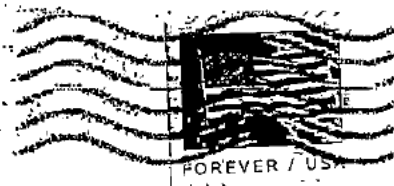
