I. Jurisdiction + venue

SC Court of Appeals

1. This is a motion pursuant to Rule 60(b) S.C. R. Civ. P. 60(b) Relief from a judgement for extrinsic fraud on the theory that by reason of the fraud preventing a party from fully exhibiting and trying his case, there never has been a real contest before the court of the subject matter of the action.

2. A judgement may be set aside on the ground of fraud only if the fraud is extrinsic fraud, "Extrinsic fraud" is fraud that induces a person not to present a case or depriving a person of the opportunity to be heard. (quoting) Robinson v. Estate of Harris, 388 S.C. 616

3. The South Carolina Supreme Court is the proper venue for equitable relief from a judgement pursuant to rule Civ Proc, Rule 60(b) because this court reviews matters of law.

4. An act of perjury or concealment of a document coupled with an intentional scheme to defraud the court justifies ~~the~~ setting aside of a judgement due to extrinsic fraud. Rule Civ Proc, 60(b)

## II. Applicant

5. "Applicant" (Demetriss A Glenn) is in the South Carolina Department of Corrections at Broad River Corr. in Columbia SC.

## III. Respondents

6. "Respondents" are Agents of law enforcement Attorneys at Law in South Carolina and officers of the court.

## IV. Facts

7. ON 7-1-2011 Applicant was arrested by Lexington County authorities for murder. Applicant was

arranged on 7-7-2011 and ordered NOT to contact the Public defender office, that I was to obtain my own legal representation.

8. Applicant presents two letters from Tammie in Cayceck-Bond. Dated: 7-20-2011 and 7-23-2011. IN these letters we speak on her contacting my Attorney to be a witness on my behalf, pertaining to the charges I was facing in Lexington County.

9. Applicant requested a preliminary hearing and one was held Aug. 26, 2011 Applicant along with Counsel (Dean O'Neil) was present. Applicant asks for charges to be dismissed because Applicant not guilty, and no evidence.

10. Det. Joe Chappell stated he had recovered victim phone as well as DNA that would solve case. Judge bind case over pending results of DNA.

11. ON or about OCT. 2013 Applicant was visited by Casey Cornwell and Andrew Sims Radeker "Respondents" who gave me several false documents pertaining to the Homicide investigation of Timothy Tice.

12. Respondents tried several times to coerce Applicant to sign an affidavit for the state placing myself at the crime scene of the Timothy Tice homicide in exchange for a very low plea, also I would have to withdraw my fast & speedy trial motions.

13. Applicant presents Exhibit (A) case supplemental Report Dated: 10/08/2013. At 8233 LE Case # 11024110, Det. Cathy Etheredge "Respondent" states Sheri Anderson provided information about her daughter knowing Timothy Tice and going to his residence.

14. Applicant advised the Respondents that the Det. was lying, that if she testified under oath to that, she will be committing perjury.

15. ON NOV. 5, 2013 Det. Cathy Etheredge testified that on June 27<sup>th</sup> 2011 she received Exhibit (A) Lead Assignment Worksheet trial transcript page 276 line 23. page 277 line 1-24.

16. Det. Cathy Etheredge committed perjury, and falsified evidence to create a false chain of custody. Applicant presents Exhibit (B) Lead Assignment Worksheet

Dated: 8/4/2011 LE Case # No24110

on this original case file document it states a caller by the name of AJ, a former cab driver gave the name "Roxy" Margaret Marie and she lived on Corbett St. AJ real name is Preston Houston.

17. Sheri Anderson actually told investigators her daughter had in fact moved out a week ago. Applicants present Exhibit (c) Interview report of Sheri Anderson 4533 Corbett Street Columbia Sc. 29209 on OCT. 30 at 6:30pm she unequivocally denies: she called the police or crime stoppers, she does not know how the police got her Name.

18. let the record reflect at this time Det. Cathy Etheredge a Vet. Law Enforcement Agent of the Lexington County Sheriff Department motor crime investigations unit perjured at Applicants NOV. 2013 trial.

19. Testimony of Det. Joe Chappell (A<sup>n</sup>)  
questioning by Rick Hubbard (Q<sup>n</sup>)

Trial Transcript page 353 line 18-19 Q: Did you ask him if he had a permanent address?

A: Line 20-24 I did, he said he was homeless, but kept clothes at Tammy's house.

Trial Transcript page 354 line 1-2 Q: Did you ever find out who Tammy was?

A: Line 3 - NO SIR.

20. Let the record reflect at this time Respondent testified on NOV. 2013 at Applicant trial, that he never found out who Tammy was.

21. Applicant presents Exhibit (E) Case Supplemental Report Dated: 8/4/11 LE Case # 11024110 which states on 7/4/2011 - At approximately 1000 hrs. I/O and Det. Etheredge met with Tammy Laycock.

22. Not only did Respondents commit perjury, suppress evidence, and falsify evidence to get me convicted of crimes. Respondents know I never committed, they did it with malice and with the aid of officers of the Court.

23. Applicant presents Exhibit (E) Case Supplemental report Dated: 8/4/2011 LE# 11024110. States as follows on 7-4-2011 - At approximately 1000 hrs I/O and Det. Etheredge met with Tammy Loycock at the West Columbia Wal-Mart. Tammy wanted to show Det. Warr Demetrius "hid out" in the past.

24. Applicant presents Exhibit (G) Case Supplemental report of Cathy Etheredge - States as follows, on the morning of 6-28-2011 Applicant, Tammy Marie Loycock-Bond, and Margaret Driggers, was together etc.

25. Applicant presents Exhibit (F) Case Supplemental report Dated: 8/04/2011 LE# 11024110 Based on the information received from Tyrone and Marie

Warrant M-302883/murder was obtained for  
Demetrius Alshawn Glenn. Tyrone told Respondent  
I gave him a rifle belonging to the victim and I  
specifically came to his house on the morning  
of 6-28-2011.

According to Exhibit (G) Case Supplemental re-  
port of Det. Cathy Etheredge, on the morning of  
6-28-2011 she was watching Applicant who was  
with Tammie in Laycock-Bond, IN Cayce St.

22. Applicant presents two letters from Tammie in  
Laycock-Bond Dated: 7-20-2011 and 7-23-2011,  
In these letters we speak on my court date  
and her being there, as a witness on my be-  
half.

28 This is the reason Det. Tbe Chappell and  
Det. Etheredge perjured at Applicant's Nov.  
2013 trial. So Rich Hubbard and Shawn Gra-  
ham could deceive the court, After Plaintiff  
DNA was excluded from all DNA evidence  
in the Homicide of Timothy Tice.

29. Sanders v. Smith, 431. S.C. 605. Fraud upon the court, as a ground for relief from judgement is a narrow and invidious species of fraud that subverts the integrity of the court itself or is a fraud perpetrated by officers of the court so that the judicial machinery cannot perform in the usual manner its impartial task of adjoining cases that are presented for adjudication.

30. Like all other types of fraud, proving fraud upon the court, as a ground for relief from judgement requires showing that a perpetrator acted with intent to defraud, for there is no such thing as accidental fraud.

#### V. Summary

31. Applicant reallege and incorporate paragraphs 1-30. Applicant was arrested without lawful justification on 2-1-2011 by Respondents for murder. Applicant was an alibi witness. Tammie m. Laycock-Bard, which in fact is corroborated by Det. Etheredge. "How ironic."

32. Due to pre-trial publicity by solicitor Shuman  
Graham, Applicant motion for a fast & speedy  
trial. Judge Maddox set trial Feb. 2013.

33. Respondents failed to honor date, again in  
April Applicant exerted his right to fast &  
speedy trial, Judge Newman set trial date  
for Aug. 2013. Again date was not honored.

34. Respondents found out Applicant Alibi witness  
Tamara in laylock-Bond had passed away, and  
proceeded to trial knowingly using false test-  
imony. Miller v. Pate, 386 US 1 (1967) knowing  
use of perjured testimony. USCIA Const. Amend

14. Fourteenth Amendment cannot tolerate a  
State Criminal conviction obtained by knowing  
use of false evidence. Mooney v. Holohan, 294  
US 103, 55 S. Ct. 340, 79 L. Ed. 791 Napue at 368  
264, Pyle at 317 US 213. Alcorta at 355 US  
298. There can be no retreat from this principle.

35. "Unlawfully spending time incarcerated due to  
prosecutorial withholding cannot be cured by a

new trial, the impact of the misconduct was <sup>not</sup> systematic, but was a fraud upon the court."

36 Applicant would like to thank the court at this time, and say due diligence from an innocent man fighting for his freedom is what compels me to pursue relief before this Honorable Court.

### VI. Prayer for relief.

37. Equitable relief from sentence and convictions, a decree stating the acts committed violated Applicants State and Federal Constitutional rights, and whatever equitable relief this Court deems just and proper.

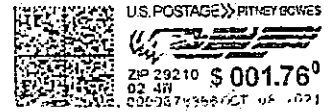

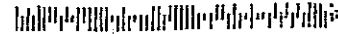

1524hrs. Met with Melissa Hayes, at her residence, [REDACTED] SC. Melissa stated she had been at Timothy's residence most of the day Saturday and left there at approximately 11:00p.m. She stated she had only known him for about two weeks, and she met him through her dad, Billy Hayes. Melissa said Timothy always keeps his phone on his clip, or on the wooden table in the kitchen area. Melissa stated Tonya owed a guy a bunch of money. She was very controlling and very jealous. The door was opened when she arrived, she stepped in and called out "Timmy T" and saw him lying on the floor in a lot of blood.

1028hrs. I received a LEAD ASSIGNMENT WORKSHEET that a Sheri Anderson had provide information about her daughter knowing Timothy and going to his residence. She stated we should call her daughter, "Roxy" Margaret Marie Driggers, who was at the Master's Economy Inn, Room 209. I called both Master's in Cayce and found out that she was at the Master's on Commerce Drive. I spoke with a female that was in Room 209 and she was very evasive about who she was, and stated she was not "Roxy" nor Margaret Marie Driggers. She asked what this was all about and would not talk to me.

6-28 1024hrs. I called Sheri Anderson to make sure this was the right information that was provided on the LEAD ASSIGNMENT WORKSHEET. Sheri said her daughter, Marie, called her house and asked if the kids could spend the night. The children were picked up by her other daughter at 4:00p.m. from Room 209. Sheri said Marie was shocked to know the police were looking for her. Sheri said Marie is with a Black male that goes by the name of "Rest" from Fairfield. Sheri did not know Marie's cell number because she had recently gotten a new one. I called Room 209 again and asked to speak to Marie and the female stated she was Marie. I told her I needed some information from her about Timothy Tice. I asked her if she could meet me and she said she was about to get in the shower. I asked when was the last time she saw Timothy and she said "I usually go and see him every week. I either saw him on Thursday or Friday. No, it was Friday about 9:30 or 10:00p.m. cause I left at 10:30p.m. cause he was tired. She said she knew it was 10:30p.m. because she made it to Shaggy's before 12:30a.m. I met with Margaret Marie Driggers and she said Timmy was asleep when she got there. He does Meth and he was waiting on somebody that night. She didn't know who. She said Timmy stays up for long periods of time because he does Meth. He had family staying with him from out of town two weeks ago. Marie said she and Timmy had oral sex, they were good friends. She would bring him somebody "off the street or the call service." He gave her \$100 about a month ago. Marie said Timmy called her that night even after she left him. He called her to make sure she got home. While she was there he drank a little bit of Bud Light. Marie said she drank wine. She was taken there by a Black female, Mrs. Sharon, who drove an old brownish-gold Ford and she lives off North Main Street. Marie said while she was there, she noticed some "women's stuff at his kitchen table...flip flops."

At approximately 4:56p.m., Marie Driggers called me and said the man with the Meth is Rox. There's a female hooker, Alex, that is at the Bush River Road Motel that has a bar in it. She believes this is where Timmy gets his Meth. Timmy would keep the little baggies everywhere, top of the frig. He would keep money under the lamp.

6-29 at approximately 7:20a.m., I received information that a golf cart was moved from Thomas Chumley, Sr. Mr. Chumley stated he went down to try and find the golf cart at about 9:30 Sunday morning and saw the door wide open. He found out that the cart was back at Billy's house.

At 10:24 I went to the Shell Station to see Terry who worked with Timmy, but she was not in at the time.

At 12:40p.m., I received a call from Marie Driggers and she advised that she was out at Timmy's house on Friday night

Sheri Anderson was interviewed by telephone on October 30, 2013 at 6:30 pm. She was reached at (803) 695-0374. Anderson is the mother of co-defendant Margaret Marie Driggers.

Ms. Anderson left a voice mail for me after finding the business card I left in her door earlier this date. Our representation of Demetriss Glenn was fully explained to Anderson who indicated her understanding.

This interview was conducted to verify a statement made to me by our client. Glenn told me he spent the afternoon of June 28, 2013 at the home of Sheri Anderson in the company of Marie Driggers and her mother. This would contradict what is in the search warrant affidavit for Tyrone Williams' home.


Anderson recalled that her daughter Candy gave birth to a baby in Aiken on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. She was with her daughter, in Aiken, until June 25<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup> (2013). She denies any knowledge of the Tice murder and denies that Marie ever told her about it.

She unequivocally denies that;

- She ever met Demetriss Glenn although she once saw him at a motel;
- Glenn was ever at her home when she was present;
- She ever spent an afternoon with Glenn and Marie at her home.
- She called the police or Crime Stoppers. She does not know how police got her name.

Ms. Anderson is believable in her denials.

On the morning of June 28, 2011, while I was at the Master's Economy on Commerce Drive in Cayce speaking with Margaret Marie Driggers, we were sitting in the parking lot in my vehicle. As we sat in the parking lot closest to Room 209, I observed a tall, dark-skinned, black male with braids and wearing a red shirt looking at my vehicle. I asked Marie if she knew that Black male on the balcony? She stated she did not know him. I told her I would move to the side down from the office, so no one would think she was a snitch. So I parked between the buildings. Marie said she didn't care what the people out there thought because she really didn't know anyone out there.

A few minutes after I move my vehicle, I looked up at the balcony and the same tall, dark-skinned, black male, with braids, that was wearing a red shirt, was standing in plain view staring at my vehicle. Again, Marie said she did not know him.

She finished her statement and got out of my vehicle and went upstairs because she said a ride was coming for her because she had to be out of the motel room by 11:00a.m.

I sat there in the parking lot for approximately ten minutes, when I noticed a dark red four door cadillac pull into the parking lot. The driver was a heavy set white female. About five minutes after the vehicle pulled in, Marie Driggers came downstairs with bags and placed them in the Cadillac. I noticed that the same tall, dark-skinned, Black male with braids, wearing a red shirt came down with Marie, and placed his bag in the Cadillac and they drove off. How ironic, the same person Marie did not know, she was now riding off with him. I decided to drive beside the vehicle to let Marie know that I saw her and the male. The license plate on the vehicle was FZN390 and was registered to Tammie Marie Laycock-Bond, 2035 Augusta Road, Lot 12, West Columbia, SC 29169.

When Marie was arrested and I sat in on the interview with Detective Chappell, she looked over to me and stated "and I apologize for lying to you that day at the motel, when you asked me if I knew that guy. That was my boyfriend, Demetrius. I know you saw us when you pulled up beside us." The next time I saw the Black male with braids was after he was arrested and sitting in an interview room with Detective Chappell and I. The Black male was Demetrius Glen.

Tyrone stated that he just received information about a credit card that he had that was related between Demetriss and Marie. Tyrone said a friend of his and Demetriss named, "Black" told him about a credit card that Demetriss had in his possession. Tyrone handed I/O a credit card with Marie's name on it. Tyrone did not know Black's real name. The credit card was for Marie's school program that she was taking and it deposited about \$140 per month for living expenses. Marie gave the card to Demetriss the day I/O initially questioned Marie. Tyrone said he was told Marie gave the card to Demetriss so he could "run" and live off of for awhile. Tyrone said that he took Demetriss to a Bank of America ATM on North Main Street and tried to withdraw about \$140 but was only able to get \$110 on Friday morning. Demetriss then wanted to look for marijuana. When they were unable to located drugs, Demetriss went to the El Cheapo gas station, down the street from the ATM. Demetriss bought Tyrone some beer and bought himself some snacks (Vienna sausage and soda)

7/4/2011 - At approximately 1000 hours, I/O and Detective Etheredge met with Tammy Laycock at the West Columbia Wal-Mart. Tammy wanted to show investigators where Demetriss had "hid out" in the past off of Mineral Springs Road. I/O and Detective Etheredge drove Tammy to Hidden Valley Mobile Home Park but she could not exactly identify which mobile home that she dropped Demetriss off at. She gave I/O about 4 that could have been the mobile home in the "A" section of the park.

I/O was notified by Detective Etheredge that she made contact with Kenneth Walters by telephone. Through investigation conducted by Detective Etheredge and Detective Freund, it was found that Kenneth currently has a black eye and has not been seen for the past couple of days. Kenneth's criminal history had three misdemeanor charges but nothing in Lexington or Richland County which was consistent with what Tyrone heard about the other black male not having an extensive criminal history. I/O and Detective Etheredge traveled to the Sunoco on Garner's Ferry Drive in Columbia to meet with Kenneth. Kenneth was sitting in the parking lot and I/O observed that his left eye was blood shot. It also appeared that the skin around his left eye was still bruised. His darker skin helped conceal some of the injury. I/O asked Kenneth if he would ride with I/O back to Lexington County Sheriff's Department to make a statement concerning this incident. Kenneth agreed and voluntarily got in to I/O's vehicle.

I/O and Detective Etheredge were present for the interview. I/O advised Kenneth of his 5th Amendment rights in accordance with the United States Constitution. He initialed by each right signifying that he understood each right. Kenneth said he did not have any questions and agreed to speak with investigators without a lawyer present. I/O what he knew about Demetriss. He said that Demetriss came by the neighborhood often but did not know him "that well." He said he knew Demetriss by the name of "West." I/O then asked where he worked. He said he used to work at Carolina Ale House but now works at Mezza. I/O asked Kenneth what he did Saturday night. He said he worked at Mezza and then went home. I/O asked if anyone was home with him and he replied that Moses came home late but he was already sleeping. I/O then asked what happened to his eye. Kenneth stated that he was drunk, tripped and fell hitting a boot. Kenneth said that this happened 3-4 weeks ago. I/O then asked what Kenneth did on Sunday and he

would not tell on him and was not going to tell on herself. Marie left the door unlocked when she entered so that that entry could be made to the home. While speaking to Tyrone, he handed I/O a mini SD card that he said was from a phone that Demetriss destroyed at his house. Tyrone said he thought Demetriss told him that they burned their clothing from the incident. Tyrone then said that Demetriss brought over a rifle wrapped in a white sheet and a Crown Royal bag filled with bullets. He said that Demetriss asked him to see if he could get any money for it. I/O started to get a written statement from Tyrone but Tyrone had been drinking alcohol. His demeanor was consistent throughout the interview and his speech was not slurred. He retold the story at least twice with some sections more and there were no changes in the incident. He became upset when the talk about crimestoppers came up so I/O began writing the statement as he spoke. He told I/O that he was helping with the investigation and wanted a guarantee that his family would be protected. He also requested that they received money from crimestoppers so he could take care of his family. I/O advised him that the proper method for reporting tips through crimestoppers and any compensation received. The statement was then stopped when the Search Warrant for the rifle was conducted. A search warrant was completed for 102 Dundee Road and the rifle, sheet, Crown Royal bag with ammunition and SD card was taken into evidence. I/O told Tyrone that he would be contacted tomorrow to complete his written statement. He did see that Demetriss told him that the other black male got beat up by Timmy and would have a black eye. It was injured to the point that while leaving the residence, the eye was already swollen. He did not know which eye. Tyrone told I/O before I/O left that Demetriss would call him and he would let I/O know.

While I/O was speaking to Tyrone, Detective Etheredge and Detective Govan interviewed Marie. See Detective Etheredge's supplement for information regarding the interview. Based on the information received from Tyrone and Marie warrant M-302883/Murder was obtained for Demetriss Alshawn Glenn. Detective Stoner completed the arrest warrant for Demetriss. The warrant was entered into NCIC.

I/O then received a phone call from Tyrone around 1800 hours. Tyrone stated that Demetriss called him and wanted a ride to Rock Hill. I/O notified SGT Sowards who coordinated with the U.S. Marshals Fugitive Task Force and Richland County Sheriff's Department for assistance in apprehending Demetriss. Tyrone told I/O that he was picking Demetriss up "around the corner" from his house. Tyrone stated that he would need to get gas and would stop at the Shell gas station on Farrow Road and Parklane Road in Columbia. He and his wife would get out, enter the store and allow law enforcement to apprehend Demetriss. I/O asked Tyrone if he could direct law enforcement to Demetriss current location and be "late" in his coming so Demetriss could be arrested without worry of kidnapping him and his wife. Tyrone told I/O that he accepted this danger and just requested that law enforcement be present at the Shell station. I/O advised SGT Sowards who coordinated a response. I/O and Detective Freund met with two Richland County deputies and SGT Sowards near the Shell station at Parklane and Farrow Road. SGT Sowards told I/O that there was an unmarked U.S. Marshals agent watching the gas station awaiting Tyrone's arrival. I/O advised the agent of the description of Tyrone's vehicle which was a brown Ford Taurus. I/O was notified that Tyrone had pulled into the Shell station. Tyrone and his wife entered and there was one black male in the rear of the vehicle. I/O traveled to

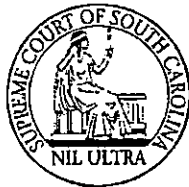
On the morning of June 28, 2011, while I was at the Master's Economy on Commerce Drive in Cayce speaking with Margaret Marie Driggers, we were sitting in the parking lot in my vehicle. As we sat in the parking lot closest to Room 209, I observed a tall, dark-skinned, black male with braids and wearing a red shirt looking at my vehicle. I asked Marie if she knew that Black male on the balcony? She stated she did not know him. I told her I would move to the side down from the office, so no one would think she was a snitch. So I parked between the buildings. Marie said she didn't care what the people out there thought because she really didn't know anyone out there.

A few minutes after I move my vehicle, I looked up at the balcony and the same tall, dark-skinned, black male, with braids, that was wearing a red shirt, was standing in plain view staring at my vehicle. Again, Marie said she did not know him.

She finished her statement and got out of my vehicle and went upstairs because she said a ride was coming for her because she had to be out of the motel room by 11:00a.m.

I sat there in the parking lot for approximately ten minutes, when I noticed a dark red four door Cadillac pull into the parking lot. The driver was a heavy set white female. About five minutes after the vehicle pulled in, Marie Driggers came downstairs with bags and placed them in the Cadillac. I noticed that the same tall, dark-skinned, Black male with braids, wearing a red shirt came down with Marie, and placed his bag in the Cadillac and they drove off. How ironic, the same person Marie did not know, she was now riding off with him. I decided to drive beside the vehicle to let Marie know that I saw her and the male. The license plate on the vehicle was FZN390 and was registered to Tammie Marie Laycock-Bond, 2035 Augusta Road, Lot 12, West Columbia, SC 29169.

When Marie was arrested and I sat in on the interview with Detective Chappell, she looked over to me and stated "and I apologize for lying to you that day at the motel, when you asked me if I knew that guy. That was my boyfriend, Demetrius. I know you saw us when you pulled up beside us." The next time I saw the Black male with braids was after he was arrested and sitting in an interview room with Detective Chappell and I. The Black male was Demetrius Glen.
