MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Counsel for petitioner respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:



Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Robert A. Baker v. The State of South Carolina with the Court of Appeals on October 14, 2021. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Antonio Sadler v. The State of South Carolina with the Court of Appeals on October 14, 2021. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in the case of Gary Z. Thomas v. The State of South Carolina with this Court on October 1, 2021.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Opposing counsel, the Attorney General's Office, has graciously consented to this extension request by way of the thirty day general consent granted by Deputy Attorney General Donald J. Zelenka for all Appellate Defense extensions through January 1, 2022. That emailed general consent was dated November 30, 2021.


