MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Jamaal Riley respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today, April 29, 2013. The Court has granted counsel three previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Mr. Riley respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.


3. On April 26, 2013, counsel filed a Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Jonathan Byers v. State in the Supreme Court. On April 25, 2013, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in West Webb Mitchum v. State in the Supreme Court. On April 15, 2013, counsel filed a brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Ricky Bowman in this Court. On April 9, 2013, counsel filed a Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Montag Webb v. State in the Supreme Court. On April 8, 2013, counsel filed a brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Jabbarie Brown in this Court. On April 2, 2013, counsel held an oral argument in State v. Brandon Rogers before this Court. On April 1, 2013, counsel filed a brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Eric Shoddy in this Court; and counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix, along with a petition for writ of certiorari pursuant to Austin v. State in Randy Bryant v. State in the Supreme Court. On March 22, 2013, counsel filed a Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Antonio Lamont Boykin v. State in the Supreme Court; and counsel filed a Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in David Fitch v. State with the Supreme Court. On March 8, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Crystal Nicole Thomas with this Court. On March 6, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Eugene Santiago v. State in the Supreme Court. On March 5, 2013, counsel held oral arguments in State v. Christopher Watson, and in State v. Joseph Cobb, before this Court. On February 27, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Martina R. Putnam v. State in the Supreme Court.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.






