MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO
SERVE AND FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Kareem Stevenson respectfully requests a **fourth and final thirty (30) day extension until February 11, 2022**, in which to serve and file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in the above-referenced case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Kareem Stevenson respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.


3. Counsel filed the brief of appellant in the State v. Jermaine Silas White with this Court on January 7, 2022. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of State v. Jeffery James Williams with this Court on December 22, 2021. Counsel filed the Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Quentin D. Hardy v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 29, 2021. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in the case of State v. Carmie Josette Nelson with the Supreme Court on November 19, 2021.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.




