My name is McKinley Wright Jr. the reason why I am appealing the Honorable Judge Shirley C. Robinson ruling and decision is because she left out all my information and evidence that I wrote to the Administrative Law Court concerning SEFA Transportation and DEW I was fired because a lie Cory Robinson the supervisor for SEFA Transportation wrote behind my back just to satisfy Jim Widow Field the President of SEFA Transportation saying that I was unsafe and I called him and I told him that he needed to talk to the people at Winyah Star Plant overloading the truck trying to put two loads on one trailer he did not tell me anything but to write my time down when I get to the yard and the next morning I took that load to Oak Ridge Landfill

and when I was backing the truck up to dump the load the backhoe loader told me to bring it closer to him when I lifted the bead the truck turned over on the right side on me and that's why they got mad and fired me Tommy the supervisor from St. George Plant was the first one to come to me and said whoever load the truck put too much on one side causing it to flip over Jody Neuroth the safety man testified and said that he cannot say that I was unsafe but they still fired me none of SEFA's supervisors have been to Oakridge landfill until the accident happened and after they fired me they stopped the trucks like I was driving from going in there and started putting the material on a belt trailer and the ash got stuck on the belt trailer and wouldn't come out and it was unjustified

the way SEFA Transportation fired me in the midst of the pandemic and I was hurt on the job and stopped me from seeing the doctor when he was treating me and deny my workers Comp. and Unemployment Benefits and DEW and Honorable Judge Shirley Robinson said I had misconduct but SEFA Transportation is the one with the racial hate behavior in their heart I cannot see how Judge Shirley C. Robinson and DEW took all my rights when I gave witness names These are the witness names that knew that the ash was wet Cory Robinson the supervisor Beth Day the dispatch Al Delp the supervisor at Winyah Star Plant and Chrysti Aman was the dispatch for SEFA Transportation and these were the drivers that were hauling the ash Pierre Deeds and Harison White and these

My name is Mckinley Wright Jr.
and I am appealing the
Appellate and the SCDEW
and attorney Steven Jordan
attorney for SCDEW because

it was unjustified the way SEFA Transportation fired me in the midst of the pandemic. I have a wife and a family to take care of because I am the only one working.

I was fired all because Cory Robison the supervisor lied on me and said that I was unsafe and caused the truck to turn over. Cory

Robison the supervisor called me on March 12, 2020 that evening, and told me to pick up a load of ash from Winyah Star Plant.

I went and picked up the load of ash like the supervisor told me, it was not my fault that he told me to pick up.

When I got on the scale, it showed 99,740 I called Cory the supervisor back and told him he need to talk to the people at Winyah Star Plant loading the ash trying to

pack two loads on one trailer. The only thing he told me was to write my time down when I get to the yard. I went and dumped the load out to get it to the right weight the ash was being fire hot the loader at the Star Plant had to spray water on it to cool it down. Before they load it on the trailer, and the next morning on the 13th, I took the load to Oak Ridge Landfill when I was coming into Oak Ridge Landfill circling around where they dump the ash out at the loader at Oak Ridge told me to bring the load closer to him where he was pushing the ash up. I parked the truck and got out and looked at the ground to make sure it was level. I unlocked my tailgate and went back in the truck to dump the load

When I lifted the bed to dump the load the truck turned over on the right side of me. I called Cory and told him what happened, he said he was coming to me but the supervisor Tommy from St. George Plant came to me first and he looked at it and said it looked like whoever loaded the truck put too much on one side to cause the trailer to turn over. And the safety man Jody Neuroth came to me and looked at it and said that the ground was level I wrote my report and gave it to Cory Robison at Oak Ridge Landfill he gave it to Jody Neuroth the safety man and didn't make a copy of it there for him. On Sunday the 15th around 7:30 p.m. Cory called me and told me he gave Jody my report and he didn't have a copy of it.

I told him I had already gave him my report at the landfill and he wrote the report to Billy Bronson and he wrote on there that I was unsafe behind my back without letting me see the report. And I was fired on March 17, 2020 and he called me back on March 18, 2020 and told me it was heartbroken what Tiffany Peake, Billy Bronson and them done to me on the job and he was the one that recommend me to be fired. And I was hurt on the job at the same time, and they denied my Workers Comp., and stop me from seeing the doctor while he was treating me, and denied my unemployment benefits. and the Appellate and the SCD~~E~~W and attorney Steven Jordan saying that I had a bad misconduct on the job. And that SEFA Transportati

is right and they are the one with the bad racial behavior hate. in their heart fighting against an innocent man in the midst of the pandemic when the government is trying to help people overcome the pandemic. And Gina Pendergrass denied that the ash was being wet when we hauled it. She don't know what we be doing, she is not the dispatch. And the Appellate, SCDEW, and Steven Jordan are not the dispatch. They stated in their report that it rained the night before I took the load to Oak Ridge Landfill they lied there and they lied and said that I didn't report the safe load, I called Cort Robison the supervisor and told^{him} he already knew that the ash was being wet when we hauled it. These are the people who know

that the ash was being wet when we hauled it: Cory Robison the supervisor, Beth Day the dispatch, Al Delp the supervisor at Winyah Star Plant, Chrysti Amann was the dispatch for SEFA Transportation. And these are the drivers that were hauling the ash: Pierre Deeds, and Harrison White. These are the loaders at Winyah Star Plant that were loading the ash knowing that the ash was hot and had to spray water on it. Mr. Wayne and Mr. Rodger. And after they fired me, they stopped all the dump-bucket trucks from going into Oak Ridge Landfill like I was driving. And started putting the ash on the belt trailer that spins the ash out. So they know in their heart that the ash was being wet, that's why they changed up

and got mad because the truck turned over and fired me because I was black and they wanted to frame it on me like I was unsafe. I did everything that was right on the job. I have 25 years of experience on safety and I have 13 years of truck driving experience. For them to be calling me unsafe, and it hurts inside to know that people call you unsafe and abuse you and you know you were right and not wrong. A copy of this has been sent to all three parties.

Dear Administrative Law Court,

My name is Mckinely Wright Jr., and I am appealing the decision ruling that the Honorable Judge Robinson made. Saying that I have a history of unsafe behavior on the job. Because you can't say that I am unsafe, and SEFA Transportation did not give me a drug test or did not find any alcohol in my system. The South Carolina Department of Unemployment and Workforce cannot say that I was unsafe either because they have never been to the landfill to see that I was unsafe, and also SEFA Transportation company employers have never been to the landfill until the accident happened. After the accident happened SEFA Transportation stopped the trucks like I was driving from going into the landfill and started putting the material in a belt tailor that spins the ash out. The ash got stuck in the belt tailor and wouldn't come out of the belt tailor. The safety specialist Jody Neuroth already testified that he couldn't say that I was unsafe because the truck was already turned over before he got there. Tommy the supervisor from Saint George plant came to me first and looked at it and said it looked like whoever loaded the truck looked like they put too much on one side causing the truck to turn over. SEFA Transportation denied that I told anyone about the truck was over weighted when I got on the scale. I wrote on paper to the Administrative Law Court that I told Cory Robinson that he needed to talk to the people at Winyah Star Plant that they were trying to load two trucks on one tailor. The truck was not overweight when I took it to the landfill, but the attorney Grant M. Willis lied for SEFA Transportation and wrote in his report that I drove the overweighted truck to the landfill and didn't tell anyone about it. Gina Pendergrass lied and said that there was no record of them knowing that the ash was being wet at the Star Plant. I gave a list of witness names that know the ash was wet, and none of that was viewed in my favor. Gina Pendergrass doesn't know what we do because she is not the dispatch. I was fired all because of a lie that Cory Robison wrote in his report to satisfied ~~an~~ Widowfield the president of SEFA Transportation and I was hurt on the job and fired at the same time and they also stopped me from seeing the doctor while the doctor was treating me. They also denied my works compensation because of a lie. SEFA Transportation are the ones with the misconduct and racial behavior, and nobody said anything about that fired during the pandemic with a family with no income coming in and the DEW has the nerve to say I have the misconduct and SEFA Transportation has the racial behavior hate in their heart. I am also requesting a hearing.
