To the Honorable's of the SC court of appeals:

I'm writing you on behalf of my fiancé Robert Hawkins, who has been wrongfully convicted of armed robbery. In correspondence to the brief sent to him on December 21, 2021 by his appeals attorney who has discovered prejudices in his trial starting on the 7th page of his 110 page transcript, we would like to inform of a lot of other wrong doings in his case as well; including proof of the prosecutor Kimberly Lesenick coming across county and state lines to serve me and my father with illegal subpoenas with no county or state authorities and without those authorities consent or even knowledge of what she was doing and that's just the beginning. We also have copies of the body cam videos of the officers that responded to the call where an eye witness to the robbery identifies someone other my fiancé Robert as being the perpetrator; on top of no actual forensic evidence that Robert committed this crime because he didn't. How do I know because the night of the robbery he was at home with me and our 3 children having our first family game night celebrating his success of getting a new job which he had just attended the orientation to that day which also wasn't allowed into the trial by the same judge. Robert's appeals attorney is asking that the judge's decision be overturned and a retrial be issued or his case to be passed down to a lower court. I'm asking for the opportunity to present all the evidence we have so you can see my fiancé is innocent and you dismiss the case altogether. Either way I would also like you to know I've filed a Post Conviction Relief for Robert myself and had it processed into the system even before his public defender Tracy Racine actually filed his appeal because had I waited for her to get it done then it would not have happened. Please get back to me as soon as possible. Thank you for your time and I look forward to working with you to seek justice and equality in Robert's case.
