This information should be provided by e-mail to suptfilings@sccourts.org by Monday, April 11, 2022. Depending on number of individuals who will be present, seating may be assigned.

As an alternative to attending the arguments at the Supreme Court Building, the arguments may be viewed via live-stream on the Supreme Court Video Portal at <https://www.sccourts.org/SCvideo>. In addition to live streaming, a recording of the arguments will be posted to the Video Portal on the afternoon following the arguments.

Because the risk posed by COVID-19 has decreased and vaccinations are now widely available, masks are no longer required in the Supreme Court Building. However, all individuals entering the Supreme Court Building will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms, and anyone who is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past seven days will not be permitted into the building.
