Dear Mr. Clemons:

Your email received on March 18, 2022 is being construed as a motion to allow late filing of your initial reply brief and designation of matter, the following deficiencies have been noted under the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), and each deficiency must be corrected within ten (10) days of the date of this letter or this Court will not accept your appellant's initial reply brief and designation of matter:

- The required filing fee has not been submitted. The correct filing fee is \$50.00.
- A proof of service has not been provided. You must serve and file a proof of service substantially in the format shown by Form 7 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR.

Furthermore, the Court has received your voicemail dated April 4, 2022, inquiring about the next steps to perfect the appeal. In addition to paying a \$50 filing fee to accept the appellant's initial reply brief and designation of matter out of time and a proof of service for your motion, the next step for perfecting the appeal is preparation of the record on appeal. As the appellant, you are responsible for

serving and filing the record on appeal as set forth in Rule 210, SCACR. You must serve a copy of the record on appeal on the respondent within 30 days of the date of this letter and provide a proof of service to the Court or the appeal will be dismissed. The final briefs of all parties must be served and filed within 20 days after service of the record on appeal, as set forth in Rule 211, SCACR.
