MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO
SERVE AND FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Christopher Blake Hallbrook respectfully requests a **fourth and final thirty (30) day extension from April 20, 2022, until May 20, 2022**, in which to serve and file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in the above-referenced case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Christopher Blake Hallbrook respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.


3. On April 13, 2022, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in The State v. James Allen Johnson with the Supreme Court. On April 4, 2022, counsel filed the brief of respondent in The State v. Russell Levon Johnson with the Supreme Court. On March 28, 2022, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in The State v. Aaron Charles Clouse with the Court of Appeals. On March 24, 2022, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Maurice Odom v. The State with the Supreme Court. On March 21, 2022, counsel filed the initial reply brief of appellant in The State v. Bryan Austin Seidle with the Court of Appeals. On March 15, 2022, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari to the Court of Appeals in The State v. Stacardo Grissett with the Supreme Court. On March 3, 2022, counsel filed the petition for rehearing in James Allen Johnson v. The State with the Court of Appeals. On March 2, 2022, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in The State v. Jonathan Art Lincoln with the Court of Appeals.


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


