
ORDER

In the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR, Petitioner has failed to show there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, the notice of appeal filed in this matter is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.


Additionally, in light of the number of post-conviction relief (PCR) applications Petitioner has filed, he was asked to provide any reason why this Court should not impose restrictions on his filing of collateral actions challenging his 2001 conviction and sentence for voluntary manslaughter. Petitioner has failed to show sufficient reasons why this Court should not impose restrictions on his future filings. Accordingly, we hereby prohibit Petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to his previously filed collateral actions or his underlying 2001 conviction and sentence, including a motion pursuant to Rule 29, SCRCrimP, without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
