## ORDER

---

By order filed on May 4, 2022, the South Carolina Court of Appeals dismissed this matter. When no petition for rehearing or reinstatement was received, the Court of Appeals sent the remittitur on May 26, 2022. On June 6, 2022, Petitioner filed a letter requesting review of the Court of Appeals' order, which this Court construes as a petition for a writ of certiorari under Rule 242 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).

Because Petitioner failed to file a petition for rehearing or reinstatement from the Court of Appeals' order of dismissal and because the remittitur has now been sent pursuant to Rule 221, SCACR, Petitioner's petition for a writ of certiorari is stricken and dismissed. *See* Rule 242(a), SCACR (providing this Court will only review a final decision of the Court of Appeals); Rule 242(c), SCACR (providing a decision is not final for the purposes of review until a petition for rehearing or reinstatement has been acted on by the Court of Appeals); *Stogsdill v. S.C. Dep't of Health & Human Servs.*, 415 S.C. 568, 784 S.E.2d 669 (2016) (stating the sending of the remittitur ends appellate jurisdiction over a case).
